Special Alert – Historic District Changes

Changes may be in store for Salado’s Historic District. Our local government is considering approving an Historic District Overlay (HDO). If approved all properties within the historic district will be re-zoned according to their use. Example: Retail, Commercial, Residential (single or multi-family use), bed and breakfast. The next Board of Aldermen meeting is Thursday, October 3rd at 6:30 p.m. If interested in speaking, show up early to complete the form for speaking.

Narrative Plaques for Landmark Awards

Narrative Plaques will be presented to four Salado Landmark Award properties this year. Narrative plaques explain the historical significance of each site. Landmark Awards are presented to establishments within the Historic District that are not eligible for national or state markers, but are worthy of historic recognition. Those receiving the narrative plaques this year are: Stagecoach Inn Log Cabin, Guest and Sanford Feed and Grain Storage Building (now Barrow Brewery), the Norwood Home on Main Street, and the Salado Masonic Lodge.
