A Year in Review

Prior to COVID

Just prior to the COVID shut down, the Sisters Country Pickleball Club(SCPC), Sisters Park and Rec District(SPRD) and the Sisters School District had established a partnership that would allow the SCPC to establish 4 pickleball courts on the tennis courts located at the Sisters Elementary School. The Club needed to raise \$10,000.00 to repair the court surface, paint lines, and purchase/install pickleball nets. Estimates were obtained and fund raising was to begin immediately with the goal to have the 4 courts available for play in June 2020. The Club was very aware of the proposed roundabout that is pictured above but as of this date, the proposed roundabout has not been funded and is not on the ODOT schedule to be built. The COVID shut down occurred in March of 2020.

Economic Impact

If the City of Sisters had 8 public pickleball courts available to run pickleball tournaments, it would impact the businesses in town much like the Rodeo or the Quilt Show.

Tournaments can extend from one to three days or more. Players come from near and far, stay in motels, eat meals in restaurants and wander through businesses in town during the tournament.

In addition, profit from the tournament could be used to maintain the courts.

Lottery Funds

If land was donated to SPRD, this may position them to be able to apply for lottery dollars through grants. offered a beginning PB Class which filled within 24 hours of registration opening. Skills workshops were planned and scheduled for later that Spring 2020. Presently two beginning PB Classes will be offered Fall Term through SPRD.

What Opportunities May Be In The Future?

This summer there are plans to reopen discussion with the School District regarding partnership opportunities. The School District and SPRD have always had a close and supportive relationship with each other. Would the School District be willing to make property available for the building of 8 pickleball courts?

The new development that is underway on the prior owned Forest Service property is a possibility. The developers are required to donate an estimated 3.5 acres of land for public use. Would this be the perfect place for 8 pickleball courts?

The School District recently passed a Bond to build a new Elementary School. What will the present Elementary School Property be used for? Is this property available for 8 pickleball
