On March IIth over 50 people joined the monthly NTAS program to learn about archeological investigations at the Honey Locust site (41SM476) located near Lindale, Texas. Josh Haefner and Dr. Victor Galan provided eye-opening information about multiple prehistoric components buried in a setting that has been terraced for agriculture, all identified in advance of highway construction. It was fascinating to learn about the burial components, and older components with burned rock features found in the red argillic clays of northeastern Texas usually thought to predate human occupation. Josh and Dr. Galan let us know analysis is ongoing for this site, and it was a pleasure to be privy to the preliminary results. Fieldnotes from Amistad: Highlights of Working in the Lower Pecos Canyonlands



The rock shelters of the Lower Pecos Canyonlands of Southwest Texas have long been known to Texas archeologists for their outstanding rock art and extraordinary perishable artifacts. That heritage received much wider recognition this year with designation of the Lower Pecos Canyonlands National Historic Landmark district. This presentation explores the unique character of Lower Pecos Canyonlands archeology through the lens of Resource Management work and play in and around Amistad National Recreation Area.

Jack Johnson works for the National Park Service as Park Archeologist at Amistad National Recreation Area, near Del Rio, Texas. He has worked in the Lower Pecos Canyonlands since 2005, including for TPWD at Seminole Canyon State Park and for the Shumla Archeological Research and Education Center. He enjoys creating and using functional replica artifacts to bring Texas archeology to life for park visitors while deepening his own understanding of ancient lifeways. Jack received his MA from TTU, and lives in Comstock, Texas with his wife Isabelle and their unruly chickens.

Archeobotany Academy: An Introduction to Archeobotany

April 24-25, 2021

The 2021 TAS Archeobotany Academy will be offered VIRTUALLY via Zoom with an emphasis on Caddo ancestors and the plant species of east Texas. The academy will introduce participants to how archeologists understand the relationships between people and plants in the past. The recovery and analysis of macroremains (actual bits of plants), pollen, phytoliths, and chemical residues from archeological sites will be discussed in detail with examples from East Texas and the Ozarks. The wealth of information that can be gained from replication of ancient technologies will also be covered, as will the value of historical accounts, traditional stories, memories, and the ancestral knowledge held by modern Native people.
