Silver Springs Lake residents signed up for nearly two weeks of manual weed cutting and raking services from APM and for mechanical weed harvesting along nearly 1,900 linear feet of shoreline by Silver Mist Garden Centers.

We owe a debt of gratitude to Tony and Audrie Mainiero who prepared our customer lists and answered many up-front questions about these programs. Residents who failed to sign up by year end must now wait until next year. If you did sign up, APM or Silver Mist will be contacting you directly, to work out your service agreement details.
