- Our Winter Solstice Lantern Walk was a huge success. The new location was terrific and we had at least 100 people attending. Thanks also to Lynn van Emmerik for providing the mulled wine, Kim Holmyard, Kylie Clare, Kerri Tyeson, Ash Bowkett and other volunteers for helping with the BBQ.
- Planning is now underway for our WPA 75th Anniversary event. This will be held at the Weymouth Hall on Saturday, October 30 from 5:00 pm until 8:00 pm and will include:

- Following the development of our Fire Management and Community Recovery Plan, the Tas Fire Service has formally approved the Recreation Ground as our Nearby Safe Place in the event of a major fire emergency. The George Town Council has agreed to trim vegetation on the Walden Street entrance to improve access.
- We have submitted a representation to DPIPWE in relation to the application by Tas Water to draw an additional 90ML from the Pipers River. We have requested that an environmental impact study is completed to determine whether there will be any detrimental effects to the river, foreshore and local ecosystems as a consequence of reduced flow. We will keep you advised of the outcome.
- On advice from DPIPWE, we have withdrawn our application for the construction of an access ramp at the little beach in front of Clayton's house. This is mainly due to difficulties associated with Standards Compliance, public liability and access licencing with the Crown. We are currently investigating other options.
- Representatives of the **Foreshore Recreation Area Sub Committee** (formerly Caravan Park Sub Committee) met with Heath Clayton of Design Intent to

discuss a staged Development Plan for the Foreshore Recreation Area. We are hopeful that we can convene a Community Information and Feedback meeting in November at which we can consider a range of options and seek your feedback. We are grateful to Heath Clayton who has agreed to donate his services.

- The Environment Sub Committee met on July 24. Some issues raised include:

- The WPA now has internet access in the Weymouth Hall. This is not a public access site; however, it will allow us internet connectivity for WPA meetings and events. It also improves our communications with respect to emergency management.
- Our annual Sandcastle Competition will be held on Australia Day, Wednesday, January 26, 2022 commencing at 12:00 pm. Low tide on this day will be 12:46 pm. The theme for the 2022 Competition will be "Sand Castles: Grand Designs". More details will be available closer to the date.
