Recommendation #1

The Committee recommends that the General Assembly enact legislation scheduling the drug "Tianeptine" as a schedule II controlled substance in North Carolina. A copy of the proposed legislation is attached to this report as [Appendix C.]

Recommendation #2

The Committee recommends that the General Assembly continue to study the effects of "Tianeptine," "Xylazine," and other emerging drugs of concern in North Carolina and introduce appropriate legislation as needed to protect the people of North Carolina.

Recommendation #3

The Committee finds that private laboratories in North Carolina provide fast and accurate testing of emerging drugs of concern and other controlled substances. The Committee further finds that the delays in having controlled substances tested at the State Crime Laboratory is a concern to all members of the criminal justice system and citizens of North Carolina. The Committee recommends that additional funding be provided to law enforcement agencies so that these agencies can fund testing of controlled substance at these private laboratories in an expeditious manner.

Recommendation #4

The Committee recommends that the General Assembly consider enacting House Bill 563 to regulate the sale and distribution of hemp-derived consumable products and kratom products which are currently widely available across North Carolina.

Recommendation #5

The Committee recommends the Department of Health and Human Services study and determine if additional authority, avenues, or flexibility is necessary to regulate new and emerging substances across the State.

Recommendation #6

The Committee recommends the General Assembly consider mandating a substance prevention program to educate school students on the dangers of marijuana, fentanyl, and other substances and requiring all public schools to adopt policies to better monitor students in restrooms and other areas. The Committee also recommends the General Assembly consider including the appropriation of any funds necessary to facilitate those requirements, including potentially making grants available to nonprofit entities to assist in providing prevention programs.

The House Select Committee on Substance Abuse completed its work, which included voting unanimously to recommend scheduling Tianeptine as a Schedule 2 controlled substance.

The Committee also recommended the General Assembly consider mandating prevention programs to educate students and requiring public schools to adopt policies to better monitor restrooms and other areas.

Rep. Paré stated, "The Select Committee on Substance Abuse has completed its work. I am happy that the Committee recommends more stringent restrictions on available dangerous substances that are accessible to our young people. There is much more work to do, but this is a great start to

protect our kids."

FujiFilm Diosynth Biotechnologies Expansion



Rep. Paré attended the announcement of Fujifilm Diosynth Biotechnologies expansion in Holly Springs. This \$1.2 billion investment will bring an estimated 680 high-paying jobs to the area, in the second phase of the project. This phase is expected to have an economic impact of \$4.76 billion, officials said.

"It's a win for us in southern Wake and a win for North Carolina in general," said Rep. Erin Paré. "This will be a huge boost to our economy."

Wake Leadership Academies



There has been significant input to the office of Rep. Paré from Southern Wake families about the impact on Wake Leadership Academies due to the St. Augustine University accreditation issue. Rep. Paré will file a bill that will expedite the process for Wake County Public Schools to partner with another institution of higher learning to host the Wake Young Men's Leadership Academy and Wake Young Women's Leadership Academy. This bill has 100% support from both the Wake County Public School System and the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction/State Board of Education. Rep. Paré is proud to advocate for students and families.

"I am pleased to have worked in cooperation the withWake County Public School System and the NC Department of Public Instruction to finalize a draft bill that will enable the expedited substitution of a new higher institution partner for the Wake Young Men's Leadership Academy and the Wake Young Women's Leadership Academy. I will file the bill when the short session begins on April 24th," said Rep. Paré.





2024 House, Senate and Congressional District Maps





HB 898: House Redistricting Plan 2023/H898 Ed 2 (above).
