North Carolina House of Representatives 2025 Swearing-in Ceremony



On Wednesday, January 8th, the NC House of Representatives held its swearing-in ceremony for the 2025-2026 legislative biennium. Seventy-one Republicans and 41 Democrats took the oath of office. Chairman Destin Hall (R-Caldwell), was elected by the body to be the next Speaker of the NC House.

HOUSE SELECT COMMITTEE ON HELENE RECOVERY TO THE HONORABLE MEMBERS OF THE NORTH CAROLINA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Section 1. The House Select Committee on Helene Recovery (hereinafter "Committee") is established by the Speaker of the House of Representatives pursuant to Rule 26(a) of the Rules of the House of Representatives of the 2025 General Assembly.

Section 2. The Committee consists of forty-four members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The membership of the Committee shall include legislators as specified below. Members serve at the pleasure of the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The Speaker of the House of Representatives may dissolve the Committee at any time. Vacancies are filled by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. A Chair, Vice Chair, or other member of the Committee continues to serve until a successor is appointed.



The 2025 Long Session House Page Applications are available online beginning **Monday**, **January 6**, **2025**. The Page website can be accessed by visiting the following: https://www.ncleg.gov/House/PageProgram/.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

- Pages may only serve one time in the House.
- Each Representative is allotted up to 5 Page appointments during the 2025 Long Session.
- Current sophomore, junior, and senior high school studentswill be eligible to apply.

- Check the House Page website for participant eligibility requirements and available dates to serve as a House Page.
- House Pages are processed on a first-come, first-served basis.
- House Page applications are accepted until all weeks are full.
