#### System Workload is More Complex

## Nearly 12 people die from overdose each day in NC

- Compared to 2016 YTD
  - 594% increase in fentanyl positive deaths
- Compared to 2018 YTD
  - 63% increase in suspected overdose
  - 112% increase in fentanyl positive deaths
- Comparing January 2023 to January 2024, 391% increase in subpoenas for forensic pathologists, MEs, and toxicologists\*

\*Anticipate additional drastic increase in subpoenas to coincide with new DA autopsy death by distribution autopsies to have largest impact on testifying 1-2 years after autopsy exams

JOINT LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE ON HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES | MARCH 12, 2024

The Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services met on March 12th. This is a slide that was presented at the meeting by the North Carolina Office of the Chief Medical Examiner, showing the increase in overdose and fentanyl positive deaths and the increase in medical examiners' workload. Representative Paré is the Advisory Member on the Committee.

"It is shocking to see the dramatic increase in fentanyl deaths in NC over the last several years. It is tragic to see the number of people we are losing to this crisis daily in NC. We need to come together and turn this around," said Rep. Paré.

#### House Select Committee on Substance Abuse




The NC House Select Committee on Substance Abuse heard reports about two extremely dangerous drugs: "Gas station heroin" and Xylazine. Both are being abused, especially by young people, with often tragic and even "gruesome" results.

Rep. Paré joined Loretta Boniti on Capital Tonight to discuss the work of the House Select Committee on Substance Abuse in addressing the dangers of "gas station heroine" or opioid-like addictive Tianeptine formulated products available for sale to any age buyer at local convenience stores in North Carolina.

She stated, "With drug abuse rising, and parents seeing their children addicted to these products, it is important that we as legislators act."


### **Interesting Education Facts**

### Holly Springs Partners Breakfast









2024 House, Senate and Congressional District Maps





HB 898: House Redistricting Plan 2023/H898 Ed 2 (above).
