- Require school emergency medical plans and expand eligibility for school nurses (SB 411)
- Expand <u>support and protections</u> for human trafficking survivors (SB 626)
- Enhance elevator <u>safety requirements</u> for rental homes (HB 608)
- Strengthen anti-trespassing laws and property owner protections (SB 246)
- Require <u>parental consent</u> for 16 or 17 yearolds to donate blood (SB 389)

June 29th Week In Review

- Affirm <u>parental rights</u> over child's education, wellbeing, privacy and safety (SB 49)
- Increase <u>penalties for "street takeovers"</u> and dangerous stunt driving (SB 91)
- Establish <u>school safety</u> exercises, programs and threat assessment teams (HB 605)
- Expand access and expedite funding for <u>rural</u> <u>broadband internet</u> (HB 197)
- Require placement of <u>automatic external</u> <u>defibrillators</u> in public schools (HB 852)
- Attract film projects by exempting building codes for temporary sets (HB 782)
- Enhance penalties for firing at unoccupied emergency vehicles (HB 34)
- Expand and streamline approval of <u>charter schools</u> (HB 618)
