HB 8 Computer Science Graduation Requirement Becomes Law

HB8 Computer Science Graduation Requirement Signed Into Law By Governor Cooper

RALEIGH – House Bill 8, "Computer Sci. Grad. Requirement" has been signed into law by Governor Cooper. Upon the bill becoming law, North Carolina public schools will now require the successful completion of a computer science course for high school graduation, making North Carolina the eighth state to make computer science a high school graduation requirement.

"Over 70% of future jobs will require a baseline knowledge in computer science, and this new high school graduation requirement will help equip our students with the tools they need to compete in the future job market," remarked Rep. Erin Paré.

The bill passed the House and Senate with two amendments from the Senate regarding community college accreditation and protecting children from harmful material on the internet, leading HB8 to be retitled "Various Statutory Changes."

Rep. Paré continued, "I have appreciated working with Superintendent Catherine Truitt on this bill since the Select Committee on Advancing Women In STEM concluded its work in late 2022. Incorporating computer science as a course requirement in high school has been a priority for the Superintendent for some time, and a legislative priority for me this session. This makes sense for North Carolina."

Bills Vetoed By the Governor

This week, Governor Cooper vetoed the following bills passed by the General Assembly:

- SB 749 No Partisan Advantage in Elections.
- HB 600 Regulatory Reform Act of 2023
- SB 678 Clean Energy/Other Changes.

SB 749 would end political interference in election administration.

HB 600 would reduce unnecessary government regulations.

SB 678 would remove regulatory barriers to utilize nuclear energy.
