

HB 10 "Require ICE Cooperation & Budget Adjustments" Veto Override



The General Assembly has overridden Gov. Cooper's veto of House Bill 10 "Require ICE Cooperation & Budget Adjustments", putting into law much-needed provisions that require sheriffs to cooperate with ICE, clear the Opportunity Scholarship waitlist, fund K-12 and community college enrollment growth and expand rural high-speed internet.

NC House Passes SB 382 "Disaster Relief Pt. 3 - Budget - Various Law Changes"

Senate Bill 382 provides the third installment in Hurricane Helene recovery for western North Carolina.

The bill sets aside an extra \$227 million for Helene-related needs, increasing the total legislative funds for recovery efforts to \$877 million. It includes funding for debris removal, water infrastructure repairs, assistance to local governments and regulatory relief for affected communities. SB 382 also allocates \$50 million to Rebuild NC for hurricane recovery in eastern North Carolina while implementing financial oversight due to past mismanagement.

As the state waits for more federal funding and conducts disaster assessments, this legislation represents just one more step in the ongoing recovery process. The legislature will return in a few weeks to address additional needs.

On the policy side, the bill improves election oversight, removes unelected government positions, and protects the state legislature's constitutional powers.

Top-line numbers:

Hurricane Helene Recovery

- \$227 million for Helene-recovery needs
- \$25 million for debris removal
- \$2 million for soil and water technical assistance
- \$100 million for local government loans
- \$100 million for water infrastructure repairs

Other Budget Items

- \$50 million to Rebuild NC to repair hurricane-damaged homes
- Mandate audit and ongoing financial monitoring of Rebuild NC
- \$33 million to extend child care stabilization grants
- \$5 million to begin process of replacing NC State's Poe Hall

Policy Items

- Enhance election oversight by shifting State Board of Elections to the State Auditor
- Improve election trust with prompt provisional and absentee ballot reporting
- Empower legislature to defend itself in court and prevent Attorney General from undermining state laws
- Eliminate unnecessary and unelected Energy Policy Council
- Empower State Highway Patrol to become an independent agency
- Remove State Superintendent power to block charter school approvals
- Strengthen Center for Safer Schools by transferring to State Bureau of Investigation.
- Improve balance on N.C. Utilities Commission by giving one of governor's appointments to State Treasurer.
