

Excerpt from Chapter 6: "Clean Hands & Straight Eyes"



Before the wedding, the couple met and then fell in love. They confessed their love for each other and made a commitment to be faithful to each other. They promised to wash their hands clean of seeing other people and to keep their eyes straight ahead so they would not look at and desire other men or women. In joining their lives together at the wedding ceremony, the bride and the groom surrendered themselves, their love, and their futures to each other.



The journey that brings a couple to their wedding day is similar to that of our journey when we surrender our hearts and lives to the Lord.

The journey that brought the couple to their special wedding day is like our journey when we surrendered our hearts and lives to the Lord. After meeting Jesus and wanting only Him in our lives, we made a decision to turn away from sin and the devil. We confessed our sins to God and then confessed our love for Jesus. We desired more than anything to have a lasting, personal relationship with Jesus, and we trusted Him with our future. Now we are ready to make a full commitment to be faithful to Jesus. Like a wedding vow, we pledge to keep our hands clean of sin and to keep our eyes straight ahead toward Heaven so we will not look at and desire the devil and his temptations. We do this through a special ceremony for new believers called "baptism" in which we profess our decision to surrender our lives to Jesus and give our all to Him.



OUR GOAL AND NEEDS

Our goal is to fulfill the Gospel Commission by sharing Jesus with each Indigenous home in Canada and the United States through *The Moccasin Trail to Heaven*.

CANADA

- There are over 1 million First Nation members in Canada, with 1/3 living on reserves.
- Through private donations, 130,000 books are being printed for each of Canada's First Nation households on reserves! We are asking Canada's churches to distribute them to reserves closest to their church.

What you can do

 Approximately \$85,000 is still needed for postage to mail the printed books to 242 isolated First Nation communities.

UNITED STATES

- There are roughly 5.5 million Native Americans in the U.S.
- Through private donations, 23,363 books have been printed and mailed to Native American homes (resulting in 65 requests for Bible Studies)!

What you can do

- Approximately \$15,000 is needed for postage to mail the additional 18,000 books we already have printed to more homes on the reservations.
- An additional \$1 million is needed towards reaching the remaining 5.5 Native Americans.
