ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE ASSOCIATION OF GEORGIA OYSTERMEN, INC.

I.

The name of the corporation is:

"ASSOCIATION OF GEORGIA OYSTERMEN. INC."

II.

The comporation shall have perpetual duration.

III.

The objects and purposes of the Association of Georgia Oystermen, Inc.
shall be the restoration and promotion of the Georgia oyster and clam industry
to its full economic potential through all lawful means including: education of
the public as to the factors affecting the industry and remedial measures needed;
improvement of State policies affecting the industry; development of cooperation
within all fishery interests and among all Georgia oystermen to achieve maximum
benefits for the industry; and to ecoperate with such persons, groups, governments or agencies in programs or projects that shall accomplish the purposes and
objects of the corporation.

IV.

Petitioners desire that said corporation be vested with all the rights, powers and privileges now or hereafter given to do any and all things which may be needful and proper in the operation and furtherance of the above described objects and purposes, specifically including but not limited to the right to lease, buy and sell real and personal property, and to pledge the same in any manner provided by law to secure loans to further the objects and purposes above described. Petitioners further desire that said corporation shall have all the powers and enjoy all the privileges as are now provided by the laws of the State of Georgia, including any and all other powers and privileges that may hereafter be given by law;

P. O. Box 323 in McIntosh County, Georgia. The name and address of the initial registered agent shall be Lewis C. Todd, P. O. Box 323, Darien, Georgia.

VI.

Said corporation is not organized, nor shall it be operated for pecuniary gain or profit, and shall have no capital stock. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall at any time inure to the benefit of any private individuals

VII.

In the event of dissolution, all assets of the corporation shall be distributed to an organization, or organizations, which is or are exempt from taxation under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or under any corresponding section of the federal income tax law in effect at the time of such distribution which exempts from taxation organizations of the type described in said section 501(c) (3).

VIII.

The corporation shall have the power and authority to accept gifts and contributions, by will or otherwise, in any form of property, provided only that the objects specified by the testator or donor are within the objects and purposes of the corporation. All such gifts and contributions shall be devoted to the objects and purposes and in all respects administered according to the provisions contained in said will or other instrument making said gift or donation to the end that the wishes and directions of the testator or donor shall in all respects be faithfully observed and executed, provided, however, that the corporation shall not accept any gift or contribution which is to be held or used for purposes contrary to the objects and purposes of this corporation;

The corporation, unless otherwise required by the terms of such donation or contribution, shall have the power, exercisable in the discretion of the Board of Mirectors of the corporation, to retain all gifts and contributions in the original form in which they may have been received, and also to buy, sell, exchange, and otherwise deal in stocks, bonds, real or personal property, at either public or private sale, without the order of any court or other authority, and to invest and reinvest any funds belonging to the corporation at any time in such securities and property, real or personal, as the directors in their sole discretion may see fit, whether such investments are or are not designated as legal investments for trust funds under the laws of the State of Georgia;

XI.

The governing body of the corporation shall consist of a Board of Directors composed of not less than 3 nor more than 24 members.

The petitioners shall serve as the first Board of Directors and until their successors are duly elected and qualified;

XII.

Petitioners further desire that bylaws of the corporation small be adopted by the first Board of Directors. Such bylaws shall provide for officers and successors on the Board of Directors as well as additions to the Board of Directors of the corporation, the manner of their selection, and such other rules appropriate to bylaws which

have as their purpose the control and management of the corporation, including provisions whereby the bylaws may be amended. Such bylaws also may provide for membership in the corporation, the manner of becoming a member, and the rights of such members; bylaws enacted by the initial Board of Directors may be amended, altered, repealed, and new bylaws adopted by a majority of the total membership.

XIII.

The charter of the corporation may be amended only upon the vote of twothirds of the members of the Board of Directors.

XIV.

Attached hereto is a Certificate of the Secretary of State relating to the name under which said petitioners desire for themselves and their associates to be incorporated as required by the laws of the State of Georgia.

WHEREFORE, petitioners pray to be incorporated under the name and style aforesaid with all of the rights, powers and privileges as herein set forth, and such additional rights, powers and privileges as may be necessary, proper or incident to the conduct and operation of said corporation and as may be inherent in or allowed to like corporations under the law of the State of Georgia as they now or hereafter may exist.


