

## **Veterinary Feed Directive Seminar - October 11, 6:30 p.m.**

Next year holds several changes regarding how we will be able to feed and treat our livestock and livestock projects when it comes to antibiotic usage. The FDA has amended new animal drug regulations to implement the veterinary feed directive (VFD). **Effective January 1, 2017**, there are certain drugs that can only be permitted under the direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian. This will affect the way that you feed your animals and how they are sold.

Double L Feed will be hosting an informative VFD meeting on **Tuesday, October II at 6:30 p.m.** at the Hill Country Youth Event Center. They welcome you and all of the public to attend this meeting and become more informed of these changes that will be affecting all of us very soon.

Doug Hefstedler, PhD, PAS, will be speaking and discussing the new regulations that will be put in to place and how we can operate moving forward. Doug is currently the Beef Technical Advisor and Manager for Elanco Animal Health and has extensive knowledge and specializes in Non-Feed to Finish Cattle Production Sectors and Feed Manufacturing Operations. He will be available to answer questions and help us as a community move forward with these new changes, so that our livestock show kids can continue to fee their animals effectively.



## USDA-NRCS & TSSWCB Programs Available

Several programs are available for Kerr County residents to apply for and receive assistance in implementing management practices for agricultural land.

The Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP) is designed to assist agricultural producers in enhancing their land with certain management practices. Practices that address and improve water quantity and domestic animals are given high priority in Kerr County and include such practices as brush management, livestock water systems, fencing, and seeding.

The NRCS office accepts applications for this program year round and more information can be gained by contacting the Kerrville office at 830-896-4911 x 3 or visit the NRCS Texas homepage at: www.tx.nrcs.usda.gov.

The Water Quality Management Program (WQMP) is a stated-funded program made available through Senate Bill 503. It is a site-specific plan developed through and approved by the local soil and water conservation district for agricultural or silvicultural lands. The main goal of these plans is to abate agricultural and/or silvicultural nonpoint pollutant contributions to impaired or threatened waters as prioritized. A WQMP covers the entire operating unit and includes required practices applicable to the planned land use. The first step in obtaining a WQMP is to contact the Kerr County SWCD. There is no charge for the development of a WQMP, but there may be costs for implementing required practices outlined in the WQMP.

Financial assistance is available at this time in the form of a cost-share program for WQMPs in Kerr County. ## Range, Forage & Feral Hog Seminar—November 3

The Kerr County Extension office will be holding a Range, Forage & Feral Hog Seminar on Thursday, November 3 at the Kerr County Event Center. The program will begin with registration at 8:00 a.m. and the program will kick off at 9:00 p.m. and conclude around 4:00 p.m. Five hours of Continuing Education Units will be provided to Commercial, Non-Commercial and Private Pesticide Applicators.

The seminar will include information on range weed and brush control utilizing the newest pesticide products on the market as well as mechanical and biological means. Dr. Robert Lyons, Texas AgriLife Extension Range Specialist from Uvalde will discuss what new products are available as well as how to best utilize these products under various conditions.

During the seminar we will be taking this opportunity to recognize the 2016 Kerr County Hay Show winners. Dr. Larry Redmon, Extension Forage Specialist from College Station will be discussing forage management including fertilization, weed control and management of various insect pests we have been faced with this past year.

Beginning this year Kerr County will be implementing a Feral Hog Control program utilizing program will be explained with details on the various avenues producers and landowners can benefit.

Mr. Cody Buckaloo, Kerr County Game Warden will discuss Laws & Regulations related to hunting and transporting feral hogs. The Biology of Feral Swine and impacts from feral swine on watersheds as well as a demonstration of the corral trapping system that will be available to landowners in Kerr County will be discussed and demonstrated by Texas A&M Feral Swine specialist Josh Helcel.

The registration fee for the program will be \$35 in advance prior to October 27th and \$45 after Oct. 27th. Registration will include lunch, refreshments, and educational materials.

#### Hill Country District Pecan Show & Central Texas Regional Show—December 6

With the cooler weather here many homeowners and commercial growers are anxiously awaiting the Hill Country District Pecan Show & Central Texas Pecan Show, set for December 6th 2016 at the Kerr County Event Center in Kerrville. Growers throughout the Hill Country appear to be having a good crop this year and should have plenty of pecans for this year's shows. Each year pecan growers from the Hill Country area, Bandera, Kendall, Kerr and Real counties collect and enter their pecan entries to compete for awards, recognition and advancement to the Central Texas Regional Show. Growers will compete for ribbons and plaques with the Champion Commercial, Classic and Native all receiving plaques.

Immediately following the conclusion of the Hill Country District Pecan Show on December 6th, the Central Texas Pecan Show will be held here at the Kerr County Event Center as well.

Growers from this area may enter one entry of each improved variety and as many native entries as they like. Each entry must consist of 45 nuts of one variety and must be grown by the exhibitor and from this year's crop. What makes a good sample? Good pecan entries are uniform in color, shape and size; free of disease and insect markings with very little discoloration or white at the end of the pecans. Pecans should be free of splits or cracking to insure a good sample. Pecans may not be altered by marking, filing or excessive polishing, which will disqualify the entry. Each entry will be selected based on a random sampling of 10 nuts selected from the entry. The 10 nuts are then weighed in shell, shelled and a kernel weight is then taken. Based on the sized of the nuts, percent edible kernel, color and appearance the nuts are placed.
