

The **Essenes** were a Jewish sect active roughly from the **2nd century BCE to the Roman destruction of Jerusalem in 70 CE**. 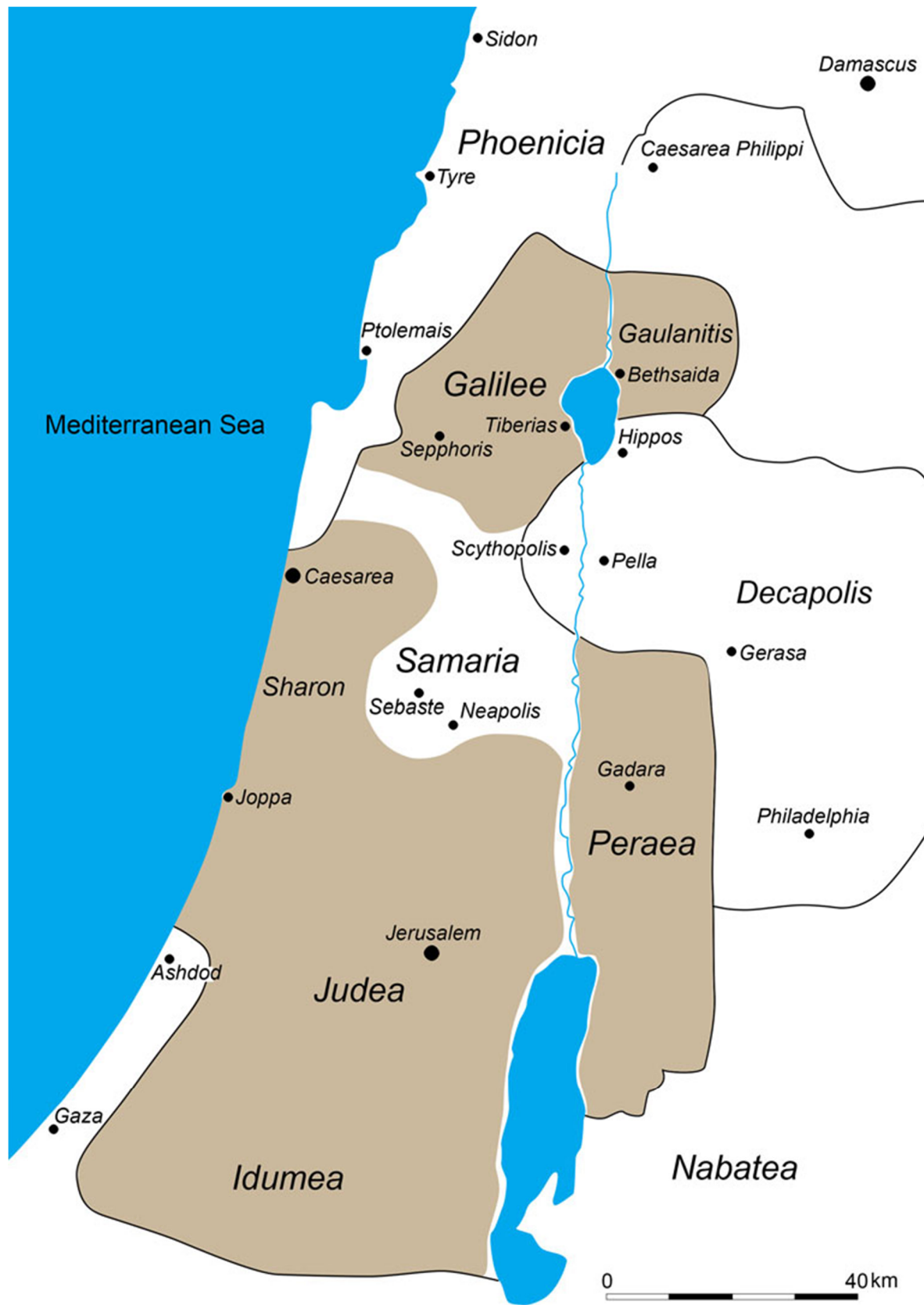

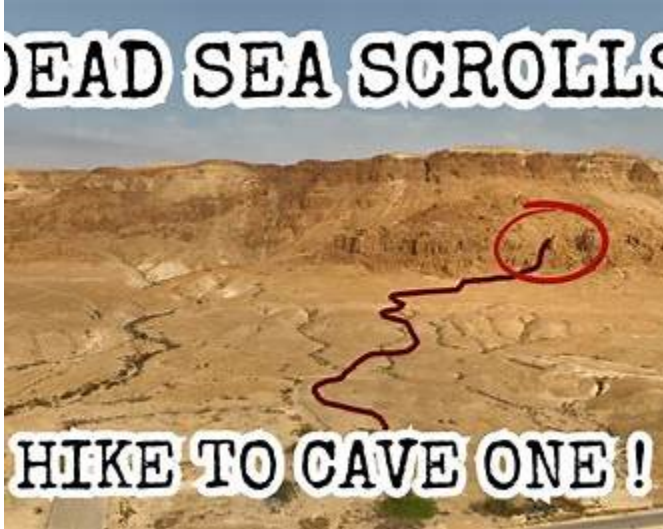

Chapter 17 – Babylon the Great

Text focus:

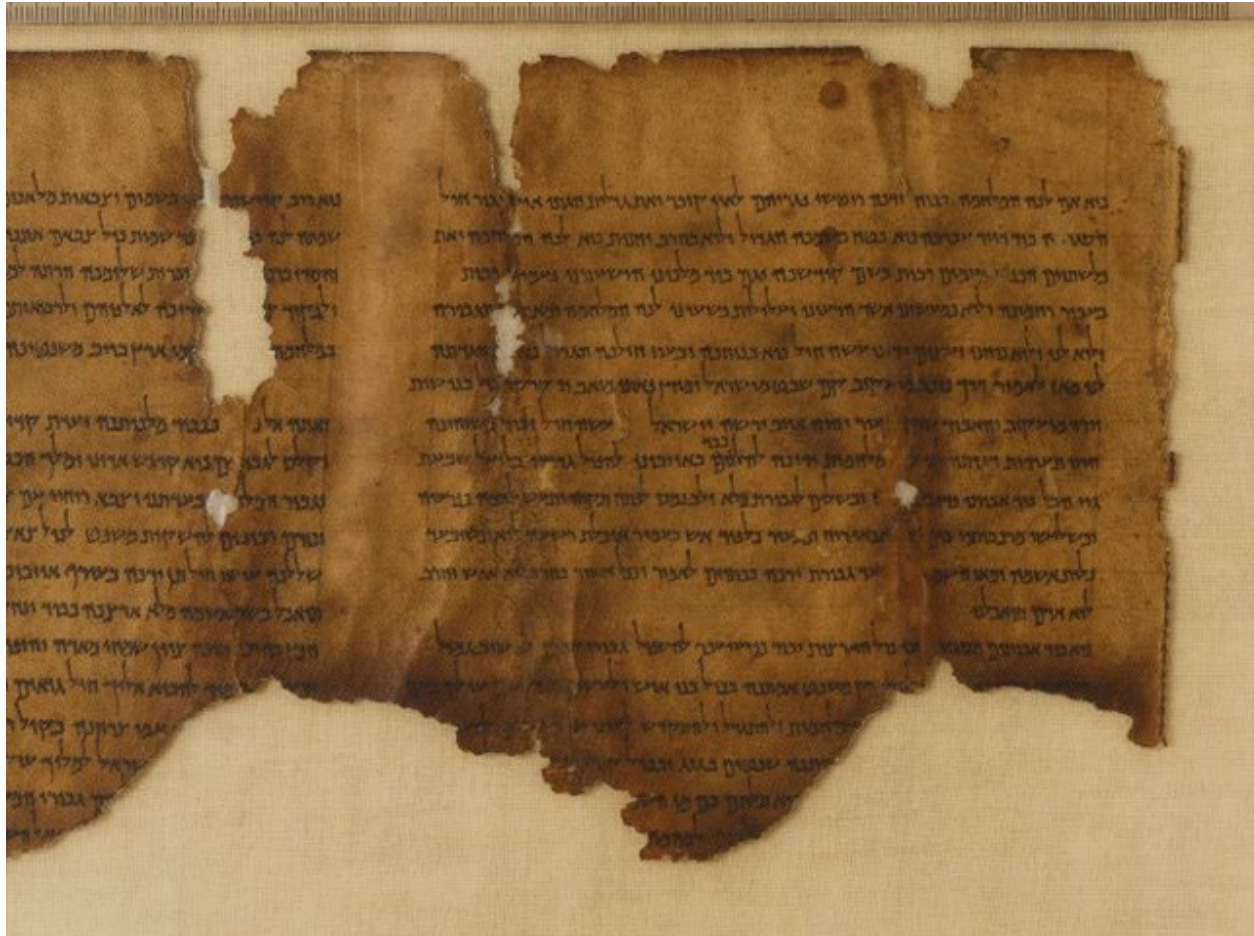
