Daniel 7 – Four beasts; little horn

- Little horn = arrogant ruler arising from the 4th beast.
- 4th beast traditionally = **Rome**.

Daniel 8 – Little horn from goat’s horns

Daniel 11 – “King of the North / King of the South”

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C. Islamic Texts (Dajjal)

Not in the Qur'an directly, but in **hadith** (sayings traditions):

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B. Medieval Western Christianity

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H. Jewish Medieval Tradition
