# Year In Review



## Audience Growth and Community Reach

- The pilot February “Lights Out” concert and April full wind ensemble concerts witnessed increased attendance and the addition of community narrators.
- Our May Concerts yielded a 26% audience increase, including a 4-year, sold out event with the Florida Wind Band & BAY Winds Youth Ensemble at USF.
- The October “Lights Out” event welcomed 149 guests, our largest chamber music audience to date.
- The annual Patriotic concerts expanded performances into Pasco and Hernando Counties at the Instructional Performing Arts Center.
- November *Heroes and Harmony* reached 317 attendees, our highest fall attendance to report.

## Educational Impact

More than 70 students performed in Autumn Winds, supported by 18 full scholarships. Students experienced mentorship, leadership growth, and diverse repertoire. Our youth ensembles continued to thrive and grow under the leadership of Dr. Matthew McCutchen & Dr. Brian J. Panetta.

## Artistic Excellence

The Florida Wind Band presented dynamic programs featuring works by Turner, Ticheli, and Daugherty. Our chamber series continued to expand audience interest and artistic exploration. Our **One Rehearsal Model** performance quality remains a defining hallmark of our ensemble.

## Community and Donor Support

Season 17 donor numbers more than doubled and community partnerships strengthened across schools, venues, and sponsors. Our organization maintained the Hillsborough Arts Council grant and received the 2025 Platinum Seal of Transparency from Candid.
