Francesca Arnone has been featured as a flute and piccolo soloist, chamber musician, orchestral musician, and educator in the United States and abroad. She has held Principal Flute, Second Flute, and Piccolo positions in orchestras in the United States and Mexico and currently performs with orchestras and opera companies throughout Florida. Now the flute professor at the University of South Florida, Dr. Arnone has taught at Boise State, West Virginia, and Baylor universities, as well as many summer festivals and camps. She has been a concerto soloist and recording artist on flute, alto flute, and piccolo, in repertoire ranging from Bach to Chen Yi. Raised in Port Charlotte, Florida, Dr. Arnone is a grateful musician nurtured by music educators in the Florida school system.

Daniel Dorff is VP of Publishing for Theodore Presser Company. A sought-after expert on music engraving and notation, he has lectured at many colleges as well as Carnegie Hall, won over 50 MPA Paul Revere Awards for Excellence in Music Engraving, and advised the leading notation software companies. He serves on the Boards of Directors for the Music Publishers' Association of the USA, Charles Ives Society, Vincent Persichetti Society, Flute Society of Greater Philadelphia, on the New Music Committee of the International Clarinet Association, and has served on the Board and committees of the National Flute Association.

"In September 2008, Kate Prestia-Schaub wrote to tell me about the International Piccolo Symposium's new composer competition.

She proposed that if I write a new piccolo/piano piece, she would record a demo for me to submit to the competition, and she would submit applications to perform it at the 2009 IPS convention and NFA convention. What amazing timing! I set out to compose a flashy showpiece with a jazzy snap, lots of idiomatic scales and arpeggios, and a scary middle section, and by mid-October FLASH! was complete.

Kate followed suit and all 3 wishes came true - FLASH! won first prize in the IPS composer competition, and she performed it both there and at NFA. In the meantime many other piccoloists have added the work to their repertoire. Cynthia Ellis wrote an article about it for Flute Talk magazine, and Walfrid Kujala commissioned a band accompaniment which was premiered at NFA in 2010."




Let's Get Social
