When I walked into the classroom Ms McKeefery was explaining the lesson to her REACH and autism students. She explained colors and the color wheel then invited a student up to the front of the room to show his leaf project work and explain his picture to the class. Ms McKeefery asked questions of the student including colors used and asked about the difficulty level of the work completed. Ms McKeefery asked questions to the group about the presenting students' artwork and asked several questions to the student presenter. Next, another student was asked to present her project and explain her work and any difficulties she experienced during the work. The students used vocab words presented, presumably from prior classes, including texture and values. If a student was unsure of an answer, Ms McKeefery supported the student and worked through the answer. She was very supportive of all students and allowed all their time to present. Ms McKeefery asked students the difficulty level of the work, most thought the leaf painting was difficult and were able to explain their reasons. Ms McKeefery asked appropriate questions relating to the vocab words.
