Our Program Details

- 10 week session- One 1 hour class per week
- Open K-12
- Boards, pieces and other chess materials provided
- Training from expert instructors
- Class Tournament with prizes awarded at the end of the session
- Cost is \$100 for the session

Each one-hour class includes 35 minutes of group lesson, 25 minutes of gameplay and 10 minutes of personalized coaching. Children meet in a school board-approved room where they will learn the game of chess and play tournament-style games. At the end of each 10- week session we feature an awards ceremony in which we encourage family and friends to attend where we will provide food and drinks. Our inaugural season at Goolsby elementary school will begin on August 26, 2021 and will meet every subsequent Thursday for the following nine weeks. The class will begin at 3:25 pm so students can go right from class to chess. There will be adult supervision provided and students will not be left alone whether they show up early or have to stay late due to unforeseen circumstances.
