Our Program Details

- **10 week session- One 2 hour class per week**
- **Open K-12**
- **Boards, pieces and other chess materials provided**
- **Training from expert instructors**
- **Class Tournament with prizes awarded at the end of the session**

Each two-hour class includes one hour of lesson, 40 minutes of gameplay and 20 minutes of personalized coaching. Children meet in a school board-approved room where they will learn the game of chess and play tournament-style games.

At the end of each 10- week session we feature an awards ceremony in which we encourage family and friends to attend where we will provide food and drinks.

Our inaugural season at John C. Bass Elementary School will begin on August 27, 2021 and will meet every subsequent Friday for the following nine weeks. (First week start date is subject to change). The class will begin at 3:30 pm so students can go right from class to chess. There will be adult supervision provided and students will not be left alone whether they show up early or have to stay late due to unforeseen circumstances.
