Words to Ponder...

Thoughts from our Interim Faith Formation Director.

June 29th, 2019

Dear People of God at Holy Love,

I send you greetings from my grandparent's home in Sabetha, Kansas. This is a perfect place for seeking respite after Day Camp's "Holy Chaos" has ended. It's a slower pace, relatively quiet compared to the constant noise of "Denver progress", and the need for chores is minimal. This is where we daily watch (and play along with) "Jeopardy!", have an hourly round of "What'd you say?!?", another hourly round of "Where'd I put my hearing aids?" and my favorite pass-time: "Hey, Alan, I have for you to fix/look at/ explain."

Grandpa is 93, and much to our consternation, still gets on ladders to clean his own gutters. Grandma is "none of your business" and is struggling with health problems quite a bit, but gives Grandpa a hard enough time to keep things spicy. Having these two in my life is a huge blessing from God. They have been and continue to be a beautiful example of love, commitment, forgiveness, perseverance, and strength in the face of grief and fear. They truly are my heroes. Watching them age and battle illness is sad, and I hate thinking of a world without either them, but I know the reality of that will need to be faced, and then—moving forward with God's help would be next.

What I've learned from their living examples through these decades cannot be taught in a classroom. How they have moved through the many inter-mingling seasons of joy, health, grief, loss, illness, struggle, and joy again with love is how I hope to move through my own seasons.

If you have a special person in your life that has done this for you, I encourage you to let them know that. Too often our elders feel lonely, and of "not much use" to their families, neighbors and friends as their bodies age and keep them from being able to express their care in the same ways they used to. Even though we never took it for granted, Grandma keeps apologizing for not being able to cook for us the way she used to on our visits. It truly hurts my heart to think she feels "less than", when I'm so very grateful for all the ways she has loved me and my family all these years.

So I leave you with this question, how will you show love today? It's a good one to spend the summer days reflecting on. All small acts of kindness count! And to our Holy Love members who may or may not see themselves as "Our Elders"—THANK YOU for continuing to be shining examples of Christian love to our congregation, and your families. We love you! "My children, our love should not be just words and talk; it must be true love, which shows itself in action." 1 John 3:18





From the ELCA

On behalf of Bishop Gonia, Deacon Erin Power, Assistant to the Bishop for Synodical Life and Peter Severson, Director, Lutheran Advocacy Ministry Colorado share an update on our church's engagement in the crisis on the border and our work to end child detention.

Child Detention and the Border Crisis: What Can We Do?

June 26, 2019

On June 6, 2019, Presideing Bishop Elizabeth Eaton and other faith leaders issued a statement on children in detention:

"Our houses of worship and agencies have welcomed, engaged and served many migrant families that have recently arrived in the U.S. These migrants have left their communities to provide safety for their children and protect them from harm. Sadly, as a nation we have denied them safety, instead placing them in detention facilities, sometimes long after the mandated 72-hour limit. Many detention centers are overcrowded and lack sanitation, further elevating the risk of serious health issues for migrants already stressed and weakened by their journeys.

We believe our nation and its leaders have both the moral and legal responsibility on behalf of those who seek safety in our land." (Read full statement at www.elca.org)

In the weeks following Bishop Eaton's statement, many more stories have emerged about this ongoing humanitarian crisis. As awful details about the conditions in detention centers have filtered into public consciousness, many people of faith are rightly filled with sadness and anger, as well as a determination to take action. Just as God has shown grace and mercy to God's people, we also seek to reflect that grace and mercy into the world, reaching out with hope to those suffering in our midst. Below are several ways in which you can respond in faith to this crisis:

- 1) Our border and immigration ministries are continuing to offer temporary hospitality to families released from detention. Support the on-going work of <u>Border ServantCorps</u>, <u>Peace Las Cruces</u>, <u>Trinity Las Cruces</u>, <u>Cristo Rey El Paso</u>, and <u>LutheranFamily Services Rocky Mountains</u> through financial gifts. Volunteer through Border Servant Corps.
- 2) Follow <u>ELCA AMMPARO</u>, <u>ELCA Advocacy</u>, and <u>Lutheran Immigration andRefugee Service</u> on social media for updates and action alerts. Respond to action alerts and share in your networks.
- Contact your elected officials in Congress and ask them to end child detention by exercising legal oversight. https://www.usa.gov/elected-officials.
- 4) <u>Know Your Rights.</u> Learn what rights you have when you interact with immigration agents or the police. Share and post this information openly in your buildings.
- 5) Connect with organizations in your community supporting immigrants, refugees, and asylum seekers such as the New Mexico Faith Coalitionfor Immigrant Justice, Annunciation House El Paso, Metro Denver Sanctuary Coalition, and the American Friends Service Committee

"Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs" (Matthew 19:14).

God of love, we give thanks for the people and communities opening their doors to welcome refugees and asylum seekers. Sustain them in their work.

God of comfort be present to the children living in detention centers crying out for justice. Let them know your peace. Stir up compassion in the employees and administrators in charge of their care. God of mercy, help us find the courage and compassion to end child detention and bring about a system rooted in your love for all humanity. We offer prayers that come in the form of tears, with sighs too deep for words, Amen



I would like to share a story that I experienced in the past. Some of you may have heard this story, but it is worth repeating.

Friends "give more"...Just up the road is a field with two horses in it. From a distance, each horse looks like any other horse. But if you stop your car, or are walking by, you will notice something quite amazing.

Looking into the eyes of one horse will disclose that he is blind. His owner has chosen not to have him put down, but has made a good home for him. This alone is amazing.

If you stand nearby and listen, you will hear the sound of a bell. Looking around for the source of the sound, you will see that it comes from the other horse in the field. Attached to the horse's halter is a small bell. It

lets the blind horse know where the other one is, so he can follow.

As you stand and watch these two (friends), you'll see that the horse with the bell is always checking on the blind horse, and that the blind horse will listen for the bell and then slowly walk towards the other horse, trusting that he will not be led astray. When the horse with the bell returns to the shelter of the barn each evening, it stops occasionally and looks back making sure that the blind horse isn't too far behind to hear the bell.

Like the owner of these two horses, we should not throw away our ability to help others just because they are not perfect or because they have challenges. Life watches over us and even brings others into our lives to help us when we are in need. Sometimes we are the blind horse being guided by the little ringing bell of those who have been placed in our lives. Other times we are the guide horse, helping others to find their way. Good friends are like that...you may not always see them, but you know they are always there. Friends "give more" in many ways that we do not realize. The sharing of our time, talent and treasures makes us the bell ringers. Other times, we are like the blind horse and need guidance and help from the bell ringers.


