

### **Youth Update**

Part of our congregation's core values includes Generational Stewardship. This means that we offer appropriate and effective faith formation opportunities across the lifespan. Our youth are an important and integral part of our worshipping community. We are looking to partner with All Saints Lutheran in hiring a combined staff person responsible for all youth events. In the meantime, Pastor Brittany and Pastor Chelsea will be co-sharing youth responsibilities for the two congregations. Additional questions on this fledging job description can be directed to Personnel Committee.

Sunday School began September 18. We're trying two classes this year, one for younger worshippers (3 year olds thru about kindergarten) and one for 1st grade and above. Thank you to Laura F. and Karen T. for your leadership!!!

Our Children's Sermons will be delivered by interested members of the congregation and Pastor Brittany. You can sign up to deliver a message on our Sign-Up Genius. Don't worry, you're given the scriptures and theme a week beforehand.

### **VRSM Update**

We took the summer to critically think about how our congregation is living into its 6 core values across over 20 ministry areas, varying from our partnership with outside groups to our connection to the Synod. We are moving towards meeting about once a quarter, continuing to function in an advisory capacity.

We are one third of the way through our three-year commitment to exploring God's desire for our congregation as we move into the future. This involves practicing new mindsets, engaging in challenging conversations, partnering in new ways, and stepping into the future God has called each of us

### Staff Update

At August's Council meeting, Lori's work hours were approved up to 25 hours per week. Her responsibilities now include coordinating, recording, and editing for the online service; compiling and sending weekly eNews; maintaining the website; updating Servant Keeper; overseeing church calendar and building use (with the exception of Halo/Kickstart events, due to conflict of interest; that's Exec Committee). September is moving right along. Our days are busy, children are happy and that makes staff happy, too! We celebrated worship with Pastor Brittany this month. The children and staff enjoyed the time, the message, and just being together in the sanctuary. Thank you Pastor Brittany and we look forward to your message next month.

Classes began learning a letter of the week and the children enjoy bringing in their collages to display. Some are really creative and personalized! Feel free to look in our hallways when you are here.

Color days have been celebrated in both the Preschool and Pre-K, M-W-F classes. The color for the month was yellow and there was a lot of bright colors in the rooms. Some classes do crafts around the color and even do their snack the color of the month---very creative ideas from the staff. Pre-K children have been practicing their own name each day and placing their name card in a feeling chart. This helps them better understand the word feelings.

Pre-K II/STEAM have been busy doing lots of fun science experiments each day, working hard on numbers and letters, and making new friends. They went to the Senac Creek Nature Center at the Aurora Reservoir on a field trip with staff and parents, learning all about animals in their natural habitat. The leader was very excited about the children wanting to learn and engage and how curious they were. Kudos to all!

The Jr K class is deep into letter learning and using their workbooks. It is a full class! I hope you noticed their handprint eagles in the hallway. This is an annual class project including a Bible verse from Isaiah 40:31 (KJV). They read the story about Elmer the Elephant and created their own Elmer's. They also did a crayon melting craft which will be displayed for them to enjoy.

Our Kindergarten children have been very busy since day #1 with learning letters, numbers, practicing all letter sounds and hearing special stories. They have had homework folders go home and the staff thanks the parents for making sure homework gets done and returned in a timely manner. The class enjoyed a field trip to the Littleton Museum, leaning about the workings of a farm and what life would be like living on one. Thank you to all families who went and participated. Did I mentioned they made butter in class? It was delicious.

All classes have been talking about fall and the change in the seasons. A few groups have done nature walks just around the church checking out the changes they see.

Our PTO kicked off the Butter Braid orders. All orders are due by October 6th and delivery will be either October 12th or 13thdepending which class/day you attend school. Get your orders in soon! This is a very big fundraiser, and all monies will be designated to the playground. Unfortunately, when the large trees on the west side of the building were removed, the roots had no place to go but under the Astro turf. Needless, to say, the turf is being pulled up because of the roots and making the ground very bumpy and unsafe. We will be looking at repairing that very soon.

The seasons change, the weather is cooler in the mornings, and the colors are changing. Isn't it an amazing site to see what God has painted for us? Not one day offers the same beauty, but it is all His workings. We are so blessed to experience His gifts each and every day. Look around and enjoy!



### **Summer Landscaping:**


Our West Entrance was beautifully re-landscaped thanks to Steve and friends just in time for our Preschool families to come back to school. Thanks to everyone who helped!
