At Elephant Village In Zimbabwe

At Elephant Village in Zimbabwe, Lowani and Patience are teaching the “New Life in Christ” class. The people there are really hungry for truth. Lowani had planted a small church there months ago but had not been able to get back to them and the people were floundering. They were interested but not able to do fellowship yet on their own. Lowani and Patience visited in June and decided that NLIC was the foundation they needed.

They will be going every Saturday for the next few months, teaching 2 sessions with plenty of time for questions and discussions, and special times for leadership training with those who have come forward with a desire to lead.

Day 1 of NLIC was Saturday, July 11. Photos are from that day. They are playing the audio class sessions in English, as a few of the people speak English, and then explaining it in their language. One of the village leaders is in the class. And another man, when he heard the teaching, ran back home to get his wife and they are in the class together. Patience is teaching the content to the children, in terms and methods that will communicate to them. Elephant Village is about a 2 hour drive from Lowani and Patience’s home. Long but fulfilling day for them and their family! Praise the Lord for their commitment, and for his marvelous work and his truth!

Indeed brother, this community is wondering how God made it for me here because all the garden surrounding my garden there's no hope to harvest anything but for me I'm harvesting both groundnuts and maize that's God's. I'm so much happier with your prayers"
