## A Tug Of War Isn't Always What It Seems, When Community & Bonds Are Formed

Reachout Trust, Issac and Caroline Dube's ministry in Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe, is launching an ambitious expansion! The Harvest Acres Project is a goat farm and nutritional garden at the Village of Dobolo.

There is hunger for God's word there and need for life skills and income-earning skills. Pairing all of that together, Reachout Trust has partnered with organizations, including LiveCharis, to build and staff the farm, and provide much-needed water to the farm and village.



Reachout Trust team and volunteers are active participants in the Victoria Falls community clean-up days. Their goal is not just cleaning up litter, but with compassion and love, they build relationships across various groups of people.

They are coming together to change the environment and demonstrate spiritual values. They even witness to tourists while they're out!



Isaac and Caroline Dube and their team are very committed to preaching and teaching God's word in remote villages, where denominational churches are hesitant to go. They also address social issues around marriage, raising children and employment. One recent trip was to Chikandakubi Village.

At the Reachout Trust's Community Centre, Isaac and Caroline partnered with organizations, including LiveCharis, to establish a sewing school. Teaching women such a practical and needed skill boosts their confidence, their self-sufficiency, and enables them to help with the family finances.



In Bukomolo Village, Butebo Home District, Uganda, John Kiuka has established Triple Blessing Tailoring School and has been providing sewing instruction for women for several seasons, enabling women to rise up, learn and contribute toward a better life. They listen to “New Life in Christ” as they learn to sew.



Just over a year ago, John Kiuka approached LiveCharis to ask for support for a new project: Women with Vision are a group of 48 women who wanted to learn to grow food to provide for their families and to sell for an income. LiveCharis helped with land, seed, pesticides, tools, and education for the women. They have had successful harvests and their farm is prospering. Missionary Shaun recently visited the Women with Vision at the farm.



LiveCharis sponsors a missionary, Shaun, who has for his two recent trips been joined by Jamuna from Nepal. They are on a 42-day trip throughout Uganda, visiting pastors who participate with LiveCharis, as well as pastors with whom Shaun has made contact during past missionary trips. Shaun and Jamuna were welcomed to Pastor Aaron Victor's church and home community. On the walk from where they departed from their driver to the church they were escorted with a parade, posters and their country flags. One of the highlights at Pastors Victor's was praying for 2 women, one of whom was over 100 years old.

**Here are two testimonies from their time with Pastor Victor:**

"In our church we have a 16-year old girl. She had a sickness which was attacking her every day. It was causing her to fall down. But on that day that you [Shaun] were praying for people in the evening, she came and you prayed for her, and she got healed. Now she has gone back to school and she is completely healed."

"There's a woman in our community. She was a drunk and used to hate church. But when she saw you and sister Jamuna marching with the band, she decided to attend church. She was encouraged by Jamuna's testimony. And also by your teaching about having a relationship with Jesus. On the following Sunday, she accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord."
