RTA Kids Performance & Licensing Policy

1. Introduction

RTA Kids is committed to ensuring that all students participating in public performances, events, and productions do so in a safe, legal, and well-managed environment. This policy outlines the procedures for child performance licensing, safeguarding requirements, and expectations for students involved in performances.

This policy aligns with:

- ✓ The Children and Young Persons Act 1963
- √ The Children (Performances and Activities) (England) Regulations 2014
- ✓ The Local Authority Child Performance Licensing Requirements
- ✓ RTA Kids Child Protection & Safeguarding Policy

All performances involving children must comply with licensing laws and safeguarding standards to ensure their welfare and well-being.

2. When is a Child Performance Licence Required?

A child performance licence is required for any child under 16 years old who is taking part in a performance if:

- √ They are being paid for their participation.
- √ The performance runs for more than four days in a six-month period.
- ✓ It is a professional or public performance that is not exempt under local authority regulations.
- √ The child will miss school time due to rehearsals or performances.
- ⚠ If a performance does not meet these conditions, a licence may not be required, but RTA Kids will always seek clarification from the local authority.
- 3. Exemptions from Licensing

A licence is not required if:

- √ The performance is held exclusively within RTA Kids for training purposes.
- ✓ The child has not taken part in more than four public performances within the last six months.
- √ The performance is organised by a school or educational institution.

However, even if a licence is not required, all performances will still follow strict safeguarding guidelines to ensure child safety and well-being.

- 4. How to Apply for a Child Performance Licence
- ✓ Step 1: Parent/Guardian Consent Parents must complete a child performance licence application form.
- ✓ Step 2: Medical Declaration A medical declaration or doctor's note may be required.
- ✓ Step 3: Local Authority Submission RTA Kids will submit the application to the local council at least 21 days before the performance.
- ✓ Step 4: Licensing Approval The local authority will confirm whether the licence has been granted.
- ⚠ Failure to obtain a licence when required could result in cancellation of the child's participation in the performance.
- 5. Chaperones & Supervision

Under UK law, all licensed performances require approved chaperones to supervise children during rehearsals and performances.

- ✓ All chaperones must be licensed by the local authority and have an Enhanced DBS Check.
- ✓ Parents/guardians cannot act as official chaperones unless they are licensed by the council.
- ✓ One chaperone per 12 children is required at all times.
- ✓ Chaperones must ensure children have breaks, meals, and appropriate rest periods.

- A RTA Kids will not allow any child to take part in a licensed performance without proper supervision. 6. Performance Timings & Restrictions To protect children's well-being, the following performance rules apply: ✓ Maximum performance hours: No more than 3 hours per day. ✓ Breaks & Rest Periods: Children must have a 15-minute break every 45 minutes. ✓ Finish Time: All performances must end by 10:00 PM for children under 16 years old. ✓ School Absences: If a performance requires a child to miss school, written permission from the school is required. ⚠ Failure to comply with these regulations may result in withdrawal from the performance. 7. Health, Safety & Well-being During Performances ✓ Medical Information: All children must have updated emergency contact details and medical information on file. ✓ Injury Prevention: All rehearsals must include appropriate warm-ups and cool-downs. ✓ Fire & Venue Safety: RTA Kids will conduct risk assessments for every venue used for performances. ✓ Costumes & Makeup: Costumes must be age-appropriate, safe, and non-restrictive. ✓ Food & Hydration: Snacks and drinks will be provided, but parents must inform RTA Kids of any dietary restrictions or allergies. Any child feeling unwell or injured must immediately report to a chaperone or teacher. 8. Photography, Video & Media Consent
- $\checkmark$  RTA Kids may use photos/videos for promotional purposes on social media and websites only with prior consent.

✓ Parental consent is required for all photography and filming of children during performances.

$\checkmark$ Parents/guardians may not take personal photos or videos during performances unless permission is granted.
$\checkmark$ Any unauthorised sharing of children's images will be taken very seriously and may result in legal action.
♠ Parents may withdraw consent for photography at any time by notifying RTA Kids in writing.
9. Behaviour & Discipline Expectations During Performances
✓ Students must follow the RTA Kids Behaviour & Discipline Policy at all times.
✓ Disruptive behaviour may result in removal from the performance.
✓ Mobile phones must be switched off during rehearsals and performances.
✓ Students must respect all cast members, chaperones, and staff.
♠ Failure to comply with behaviour expectations may result in exclusion from future productions.
10. Emergency Procedures & First Aid
✓ A first aider will be present at all performances.
✓ Parents must provide emergency contact information before each production.
$\checkmark$ In case of an emergency, children will be taken to a safe location and parents will be notified immediately.
lacktriangle No child will be released to anyone other than their registered parent/guardian without prior consent.
11. Policy Review & Updates
✓ This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure compliance with child performance regulations.
✓ Any changes will be communicated to parents and staff in advance.
