



Ukraine Kyiv Pavilion – Folklorama 2025 Yarmarok Farmers Market

Vendor Policy & Expectations

To ensure a welcoming, inclusive, and culturally enriching experience for all guests and participants, vendors participating in the Ukraine Kyiv Pavilion Farmers Market must adhere to the following policies and expectations:

1. General Conduct

- All vendors must conduct themselves in a professional, respectful, and cooperative manner.
- Vendors must be courteous to guests, volunteers, pavilion organizers, and fellow vendors.
- Harassment, discrimination, or inappropriate behavior of any kind will not be tolerated

2. Non-Political & Non-Religious Content

- **In accordance with Folklorama policy**, the Pavilion and Farmers Market are **non-political and non-religious spaces**.
- Vendors may not display, promote, or distribute any materials, signage, symbols, or products with **political, religious, or controversial content**.
- All display materials must be approved by market organizers upon setup.

3. Product Eligibility

All items sold must reflect the spirit of Ukrainian culture and/or the artisanal nature of a community farmers market. Approved categories include:

- **Cured and Prepared Meats** (e.g., garlic sausage, kovbasa, smoked meats)
- **Traditional Ukrainian Foods** (e.g., perogies, cabbage rolls, nalysnyky – prepared in advance ready for take-home reheating)
- **Homemade Preserves** (jams, pickles, fermented goods)
- **Baked Goods and Sweets** (including Ukrainian desserts like pampushky, honey cakes, etc.)
- **Handmade Crafts or Cultural Items** (woodwork, embroidery, pysanky, ornaments)
- **Cultural Souvenirs or Ukrainian-themed Products**





⚠ All food items must comply with **Manitoba Health & Safety regulations**. Vendors are responsible for obtaining any necessary food handling permits or licenses.

4. Booth Setup & Operations

- Setup and takedown must occur within designated timeframes communicated in advance.
 - Vendors are responsible for maintaining a **clean and tidy booth space** during and after the market.
 - Signage should be neat, culturally appropriate, and free of unapproved messaging.
 - If electricity, tables, or other resources are required, this must be indicated on the application form.
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5. Attendance & Scheduling

- Vendors are expected to arrive on time and attend on the dates selected in their application.
 - If you are unable to attend a confirmed date, please notify the market coordinator as early as possible.
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6. Fees

- A vendor fee shall apply, and all proceeds contribute to supporting the Ukraine Kyiv Pavilion's programming and cultural outreach through UCC-MB.
 - Fees are non-refundable unless the event is canceled by organizers.
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7. Enforcement

- Pavilion organizers reserve the right to request the removal of any item or vendor that does not comply with this policy.
 - Repeated or serious violations may result in dismissal from the market without refund.
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8. Agreement

By participating in the Ukraine Kyiv Pavilion Farmers Market, vendors acknowledge and agree to these policies and understand that compliance is required for participation.
