COVID 19

High Speed Internet coming to April Cove **YES!**

I don't know about you, but I had a "pinch me" moment because I must have been dreaming when I was told that Windstream was working on improving the internet connectivity to April Cove.

The proof is in the picture. The equipment has been installed just outside our neighborhood on 416 by the bank. Windstream is currently waiting on Navarro Electric to provide power to their equipment. Currently we average 1.5 MB of upload speed, 2 MB on a rare good day at our house. I know others in the Cove get a little better, some worse. We have not received any information on what improvement in speed we can expect. We will just have to wait and see. I have been told that distance from the equipment is critical, the further the distance the slower the speed. With the equipment located just outside the Cove it has to be better than what we are currently getting.

If you recall we received word in 2019 that Community National Bank and Trust at the entrance to our neighborhood would close. A petition was circulated and based on the number of signatures on that petition the bank decided to remain open 2 days a week. Unfortunately, Covid did deal the final blow to the bank and it is closed again. The building has been purchased by the Teel Duck Properties (The Teel Team, Re/Max Lakeside Dreams Realty). There has been no announcement of their plans for the building.



April Cove Roadways

Unfortunately, we still have major challenges







What are the issues:

This is just a reminder of the issues, see the June 2020 newsletter for more detail

- (A) Too thin overlay: Last year we changed contractors because this was occurring too often.
- (B) Alligator cracking: Poor adhesion of overlay, bad road base
- (C) Soil coming to the surface: Bad road base

Heavy equipment: Accelerates the failure of what we call the "soft areas", areas with issues, especially if there are large number of trips. Remember if you are going to bring in heavy equipment you need **to get a permit first.** This gives us a chance to flag soft areas for the heavy trucks to avoid.

The Plan:

The plan was to do some testing and **learn what we could do ourselves** to extend the life of the soft areas, so we don't have to constantly pay a contractor to keep patching them. We were then going to implement that during or normal bi-yearly workdays, which due to Covid did not occur in 2020, but we were able to do some testing.

What did we learn:

Found a source of materials that did not require us to buy by the pallet or charge us huge delivery fees for a few drums of material (crack sealer, tack etc.).

In areas where there is Alligator cracking crack sealer applied with 2 coats and cold asphalt pounded into larger cracks will extend the life of the "soft areas" **under normal traffic.** This is not a fix, but it buys us time.

Potholes and **small areas** where soil is coming to the surface can be dug out and a layer of cement or a mixture of soil and cement can be put in as a base then covered with tack, cold patch asphalt and then sealed. Volunteers will be needed to help.

Note:

Highview Circle was seal coated in 2020 using private funds from a resident of April Cove. No monies from the ACMF road budget were used for this project.

Who can get the vaccine now?

Front-line healthcare workers and residents at long-term care facilities

People 65 years of age and older

People 16 years of age and older with at least one chronic medical condition that puts them at increased risk for severe illness from the virus that causes COVID-19, such as but not limited to:

- Cancer
- Chronic kidney disease
- •COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease)
- •Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease or cardiomyopathies
- •Solid organ transplantation
- •Obesity and severe obesity (body mass index of 30 kg/m2 or higher)
- Pregnancy
- Sickle cell disease
- •Type 2 diabetes mellitus
