## Reports:

Chairman's Report: No new business to report.

<u>Supervisor Catapano:</u> Supervisor Catapano said that the E-Cycling, Shed the Meds and Document Shredding Program held on September 21<sup>st</sup> went well.

# Committee Reports:

**Budget**: No new business to report.

Insurance: No new business to report.

Public Relations: No new business to report.

<u>Personnel</u>: No new business to report.

<u>Commercial Pick-Up</u>: Commissioner Graff scheduled a public meeting for October 7<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. to discuss commercial pick-up rules and regulations. Commissioner Graff said property owners received letters from the District regarding this meeting.

# <u>Unfinished Business</u>:

<u>Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Program (NY Rising Community Reconstruction Program)</u>-Commissioner Graff said the District is still waiting to hear back from the state.

<u>Fuel Tank Project</u>- Commissioner Graff stated the Nassau County Department of Health is scheduled to be at the District Friday, October 4<sup>th</sup> for an inspection. Commissioner Graff said the District will begin fueling by Monday, October 7<sup>th</sup>.

<u>CSEA-CBA Negotiations</u>- Commissioner Graff said the proposed contract was reviewed and sent back to CSEA. He said it should be settled by mid-October.

<u>Code Of Ethics</u>- Commissioner Graff stated there is a Special Meeting scheduled for November 14<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. He said the Board will go into Executive Session to seek legal advice on this matter.

2020 Mailing- Tabled to the November 7<sup>th</sup> General Meeting.

<u>Uniforms</u>-Supervisor Catapano obtained three quotes for 200 ANSI III sweatshirts. PowerPak's was \$8,030.00, Working Gear's was \$9,163.00 and Woodsmen's Wear was \$6,393.00. Supervisor Catapano stated that Town of Hempstead Sanitation uses Woodsmen's Wear.

#### **MOTION**

On Motion by Commissioner Doherty and seconded by Commissioner Mannone to approve the purchase of 200 sweatshirts from Woodsmen's Wear, the lowest bidder, at a cost of \$6,393.00. Unanimously approved.

#### New Business:

Special Counsel-Commissioner Graff stated the Board was looking to retain Kravett & Vogel, LLP as special counsel for the purpose of conducting an investigation into the dental insurance. He said the firm submitted a proposal that included fees at \$250.00 per hour. Commissioner Graff stated last year's report from Harris Beach did not resolve the questions the Board has.

Attorney Ciampoli said in house counsel should not do review and the new firm will proceed to get a final report. Commissioner Doherty questioned the need for hiring anyone to reinvestigate the dental insurance. Commissioner Graff said he has no relationship with Kravett & Vogel, LLP except as adversaries.

#### **MOTION**

On Motion by Commissioner Samoles and seconded by Commissioner Mannone to retain Kravett & Vogel, LLP at the proposed rate of \$250.00 per hour. Commissioners Graff, Mannone and Samoles approved. Commissioner Doherty abstained. Motion passed.

<u>Private Investigator</u>-Commissioner Graff said the Board was interested in hiring an investigator to look into anonymous letters sent to residents and employers and to see what potential claims the District may have. PJD Investigations in Old Bethpage submitted a proposal. Commissioner Mannone stated he could not support the investigation because of his prior support of the First Amendment.

#### **MOTION**

On Motion by Commissioner Samoles and seconded by Commissioner Mannone to hire PJD Investigations with a \$5,000.00 retainer. Commissioners Graff, Doherty and Samoles approved. Commissioner Mannone opposed. Motion passed.

By-Laws Update-Attorney Ciampoli and the Board discussed the need to update the By-Laws regarding voter qualifications. Attorney Ciampoli explained that the boundaries of the District do not completely coincide with the Nassau County Board of Elections.

Commissioner Mannone said there have been close elections the last few years and the updated procedure will be improved and include taxpayers. He stated that there would be less Affidavit Ballots. Attorney Ciampoli

stated the new procedure will cut down on any confusion and the process will be more conformant and user friendly.

Commissioner Samoles inquired if renters would be eligible to vote. Attorney Ciampoli said that they can vote if they are registered at the Board of Elections or at the District. Commissioner Doherty stated he would like more time to review the Resolution.

**MOTION** 

On Motion by Commissioner Samoles and seconded by Commissioner Mannone to approve the attached Resolution amending the By-Laws regarding voter eligibility. Commissioners Graff, Mannone and Samoles approve. Commissioner Doherty abstained. Motion passed.

Asset Tagging-Commissioner Graff stated that NYS Comptroller reports had recommended tagging the District's assets. Assetworks has been doing this for several years and has sent a new contract. Commissioner Graff spoke with Alicia Zabala of Rynkar, Vail & Barrett and she agreed that this is important. The terms of the agreement are the same as previous years.

**MOTION** 

On Motion by Commissioner Mannone and seconded by Commissioner Doherty to accept the contract from Assetworks with a \$1,600 Annual Service Fee. Unanimously approved.

# Public Comment Period:

A resident questioned the Commissioners regarding the proposed project at Oceanside Jewish Center and what the effect would be on Sanitation. Commissioner Graff said he spoke with the developer and told him the District would like to be involved if he wants sanitation services from the District. Commissioner Graff stated that currently the property is not on the tax roll.

Commissioner Graff went on to say that it is too early for the District to take a position since the developer has told Commissioner Graff he is undecided about which of the five proposals he will select. Commissioner Graff said the Board will address the issue and the impact when the Board receives more information. Commissioner Graff also told the public that the District will not pick up medical waste.

Ellen Feinstein asked the Board if a 120 unit housing development would be more of a burden to the District. Commissioner Graff said housing would be an additional burden as opposed to storage units. He again stated it is too early to make any decisions.

Commissioner Mannone agreed it is too early for the Board to make any decisions but said it is important for the Commissioners, as elected officials to obtain information about the development of the project in a timely manner.

James Mitchell asked where his FOIL request is. Commissioner Ciampoli said it paralleled his attorney's request. Commissioner Graff told Mr. Mitchell he would look into it.

Joseph Cibellis inquired about his FOIL requests. He said he made personal requests several months ago. Attorney Ciampoli said there was an outstanding issue from a previous request by his attorney, Steve Cohn. Mr. Cibellis questioned what that had to do with his request. Commissioner Graff said Mr. Cibellis will not receive any other documents until his attorney Steve Cohn pays the \$700.00 owed to the District for his FOII requests.

Mr. Cibellis said the Board should speak to Mr. Cohn about Mr. Cohn's FOIL requests. Mr. Cibellis stated that he sent in his own FOIL requests in February and September and has not received the requested documents. Attorney Ciampoli said Mr. Cohn FOIL was on Mr. Cibellis' behalf and he owes the District \$700.00.

Mr. Cibellis then questioned why the Board retained additional counsel for a dental investigation. Commissioner Graff told him that the Board wants to know what happened and why Mr. Cibellis and nine other retirees and widows received dental insurance.

Mr. Cibellis told Commissioner Graff it was past practice long before he was on the Board. Mr. Cibellis said it was a zero cost to the taxpayers and District. He said he and the other retirees paid themselves. Mr. Cibellis went on to say that the Board already spent money on an investigation and they fired employees without a final report and are continuing to pay for an investigation that was already done.

Commissioner Doherty asked for the discussion to be stopped. Commissioner Mannone stated that the dental insurance is a serious issue and that there was insurance fraud. He said retirees cannot receive benefits and retirees were reported as active employees. Commissioner Graff said the District can sign an agreement for prospective retirees, but not past retirees. Commissioner Graff said the attorney for CSEA EBF said it was fraud. Herb Faust asked the attorney's name. Commissioner Graff stated it was John L. Allen of Whiteman, Osterman & Hanna, LLP.

Mr. Cibellis asked who will vet the voters and how will the Board inform the public. Commissioner Graff said there will be notices posted of dates to register. Attorney Ciampoli said the Board has a right to vet voters from the District.

Herb Faust asked if the criteria to vote will be published. Attorney Ciampoli stated that the qualifications will be in the notices. Commissioner Doherty said that the requirements need to be posted months in advance of the next election.

Mr. Cibellis inquired about who received the letters regarding the Special Meeting for commercial business pick up. Commissioner Graff informed him that the letter was sent to every commercial property owner.
