### Reports:

Chairman's Report: No new business to report.

<u>Supervisor Catapano</u>: Supervisor Catapano said the website signs have been put on all the trucks. On October 29<sup>th</sup> he attended Oceanside High School's Care Club and spoke to them about recycling. He also reported that he is researching sweatshirts and received three quotes for uniform pants.

The three quotes for 250 pairs of pants:

Woodsmen Wear: \$15.24-\$19.05 per pair Working Gear: \$36.99-\$39.99 per pair Atlanta Tactical: \$17.50-\$19.50 per pair

The Board discussed the purchase of five pairs of pants per man.

#### **MOTION**

On Motion by Commissioner Doherty and seconded by Commissioner Samoles to purchase 250 pairs of navy pants from Woodsmen Wear at a total cost of \$3,905.25. Unanimously approved.

### Committee Reports:

**Budget**: No new business to report.

Insurance: No new business to report.

<u>Public Relations</u>: No new business to report.

<u>Personnel</u>: No new business to report.

Ethics- No new business to report.

<u>IT</u>: No new business to report.

<u>Commercial Pick-Up</u>: Commissioner Graff said the October 7<sup>th</sup> Meeting was attended by twenty five businesses. He said one business did not know his business was entitled to pick-ups. It was subsequently arranged saving the business \$300.00 per month. Commissioner Graff stated the committee will schedule another meeting.

## **Unfinished Business:**

<u>Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Program (NY Rising Community Reconstruction Program)</u>-Commissioner Graff said the State is vetting bidders and said they will know in a week or so the results.

<u>Fuel Tank Project</u>- Commissioner Graff stated the project needs one permit and some paperwork completed.

<u>CSEA-CBA Negotiations</u>- Commissioner Graff stated the proposed contract was finalized and reviewed. Commissioner Graff said he would like to wait for a full Board before approved. He said this will be done at a Special Meeting scheduled for November 14<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Code Of Ethics</u>- Commissioner Graff stated there is a Special Meeting scheduled for November 14<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. He said the Board will go into Executive Session to seek legal advice on this matter.

#### Solar Panels-Tabled

<u>Uniforms</u>-Commissioner Graff stated the contract with Unifirst will be canceled once the pants are received.

#### New Business:

<u>Ticket Policy</u>-Commissioner Graff said a driver received a red light ticket. He said he would like Supervisor Catapano and the other Supervisors to have a written ticket policy process for the December Meeting.

School 2 Program-Commissioner Graff said he reached out to the principals and PTA's in Oceanside about sanitation programs. The high school and School 2 responded. The Supervisors will be going to School 2's Second Grade on November 12<sup>th</sup>.

#### **MOTION**

On Motion by Commissioner Samoles and seconded by Commissioner Doherty to approve up to two Supervisors, a sanitation truck and any additional materials needed for the recycling program at School 2 on November 12, 2019 at 11:00 a.m. Unanimously approved.

Computer Purchase-The Board discussed the purchase of six new computers and ten monitors from Dell at a cost of \$6,977.75.

#### **MOTION**

On Motion by Commissioner Doherty and seconded by Commissioner Samoles to table the computer purchase to the Special Meeting scheduled for November 14<sup>th</sup>. Unanimously approved.

Commissioner Samoles made a statement that, in his opinion, it was a toxic work environment at the District while he was working for the District. He said many men were either hurt and/or died due to ruthless tactics. He referred to Gene Black, Big Lou Catalanotto, Gary Torres, Bobbie Bedell, Jimmy Westbay, Billy Scholl, Norman Moyer, Ray Vanderwater, Joe Hodobler, Ray Girard, Richie Quass, Charles Artino,

Mike Kirby, George Schaffer and Louie Hyland, as some of the men that had passed away. Commissioner Samoles said several men died while working and the rest had died shortly after retirement. Frank Castano, Bobby Burgess and Walter Pfister all had to retire because they were sick and dying.

Commissioner Samoles said, in his opinion, that both Mr. Mike and Charlie Scarlata, Joe Faranella and Pete Bussa used ruthless and used spiteful tactics like keeping men in the garage especially during the Holiday season, even though these men had worked these routes for the entire year. This way they would not get their holiday tips. This was especially devastating to Billy Scholl, whose wife was counting on his tip money for Christmas that he walked in front a car and died 2 weeks later. Commissioner Samoles said, in his opinion, that Mike Scarlata was the worst. Mr. Samoles felt that Mr. Scarlata had changed and become a despicable, corrupt and deranged man. He also said that Joe Cibellis never came down to the district when the Shop Steward called him and that the Shop Steward would then get punished whenever he was called. Commissioner Samoles also stated that the only "good" days were Thursday mornings when there was going to be a Board Meeting. He also stated that they were "encouraged" to go to the stupid Christmas party, at which time envelopes were given, by the Scarlatas, only to the Supervisors and the Commissioners, in front of all the other men.

### Public Comment Period:

James Holmes stated he was at Sanitation for 23 years and he agreed it was a toxic environment, He said the first ten years were good. He said Henry, Jack Pickering, Gene Black and Lou Sr. kept everyone on their routes. He said the new Supervisors, Dan Faust, Joe Farinella and Pete Bussa changed atmosphere. Mr. Holmes said he was the Shop Steward for ten years and if someone got in trouble it got hushed. He fought for the men when they got bad routes and bad helpers. He said he painted houses for Bussa. He said it was horrible for years. He said his brother Jeff went through hell and constant abuse.

Mr. Holmes said Commissioner Samoles hit the nailon the head. He said George Schaeffer built stuff and it wasn't appreciated. He said another worker committed suicide. Mr. Holmes said he feels better telling this today. He said he left his job because of an injury and got pulled off his route and put on the rubbish truck. He said Joe Farinella made John Trowbridge and Mike Sarro pick up pails full of concrete. He said the injury from this put them out of work. He said those guys should be ashamed of themselves.

John Boero stated that there still are no limits in town.

Dan Faust said he was friends with James Holmes and let him live in his house. Mr. Holmes said things change and some guys are better and still some bad guys.

Commissioner Doherty said he feels for Mr. Holmes and then asked the Sanitation Workers in the audience if they like it now. They yelled about they got rid of the bad and got a regime changed.

Greg Parvis was yelling and cursing about everything being political. He said Dan Faust doesn't deserve to be a Supervisor. He said the District owes him 1.3 million dollars. Mr. Parvis continued cursing and yelling saying Dan's daddy got him the job.

James Mitchell asked about the accounting budget. He said that Commissioner Graff said at the September meeting that 64% of the accounting line was used as of August 31<sup>st</sup>. Mr. Mitchell sent in a FOIL request as suggested by Commissioner Graff to see the August 31<sup>st</sup> Budget to Actual Report. Mr. Mitchell said that report said that the Accounting line was 518.86 % not 64%. He asked why this was so.

Commissioner Graff said that line is over budget because the District has no Treasurer and there is arbitration pending. Commissioner Graff explained that they can't hire someone so they are using the accounting firm to complete the Treasurer's work. He said the overall budget is within budget except for Accounting and Legal Fees. Commissioner Graff said they moved money at the September Meeting from the money saved on Workers' Comp Insurance. He stated they are not using Surplus money.

Herb Faust said that he asked questions at the July 11<sup>th</sup> Meeting during Public Comment time. He said he reviewed the Minutes on the District's website and found omissions. Mr. Faust said Mr. Cibellis asked who hired Wayne Vurture and he did not see that included in the Minutes. Commissioner Graff said a Motion was made at a meeting to pay Wayne Vurture. Commissioner Graff said there was a consensus among the Commissioners to pay Mr. Vurture for completing the payroll verification. Commissioner Graff said there was a Motion at a meeting. Mr. Faust said the meeting was not posted on the District's website.

Mr. Faust asked if there was a motion, a vote and a meeting. Commissioner Graff said the Board members he spoke to all the Board members. Mr. Faust stated that Commissioner Horowitz said that all members discussed hiring Wayne Vurture and that is not in any Minutes on the website. Commissioner Graff said there was a meeting when the Board retroactively approved the hiring of Mr. Vurture. Commissioner Graff said Mr. Faust pointed out that it was not in the minutes.

Mr. Faust said Minutes of Meetings have prior approval of payments. He said the Board authorized hiring Mr. Vurture and approved payment after. He said it was ratified at the end and paid before it was ratified. Mr. Faust asked who made the decision that consensus and not a vote was okay. Commissioner Graff said Board members can be polled and implement necessary actions and then it can be ratified after at a meeting. Commissioner Graff used tonight's School 2 approved visit as an example.

Commissioner Doherty said he did not know about hiring Mr. Vurture until afterwards. Commissioner Graff said it was discussed in Executive Session with Commissioners Mannone, Horowitz and Lanning. He said he was not sure if Commissioner Doherty was there.

**MOTION** 

On Motion by Commissioner Samoles and seconded by Commissioner Doherty to enter into Executive Session. Unanimously approved.

**SESSION** 

EXECUTIVE Board went into Executive Session at 7:11 p.m. to discuss matters involving the employment history of particular persons, pending litigation and for the purpose of soliciting and receiving legal advice.

MOTION

On Motion by Commissioner Doherty and seconded by Commissioner Samoles to exit Executive Session at 8:45 p.m. Unanimously approved.
