## <u>Dear Friends and Members of St. John's Congregations, Brothers</u> and Sisters in Christ Fellow Redeemed,

Most of you know that I like old things; antique furniture (organs), historic buildings, archaeology, etc. Yet when I was growing up, I can clearly remember my parents saying that they were surrounded by that old stuff growing up, now they want something new. As life has taught me, many people (even those who appreciate the old) enjoy or even long for something new.

Maybe that is why the New Year has become such a celebration down through the ages. The lure of the New Year seems to be with the feeling of starting off new and fresh and putting the problems and failures of the past behind us.

New Year—while it is a secular celebration—it is a great opportunity to realize that there is one place that we are given the true opportunity to get a fresh start, to begin new.

The Bible tells us in Lamentations 3:22-23, "It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. They are <u>New</u> every morning: Great is they faithfulness. (KJV)

For the Christian every day is the beginning of a New Year—in regard to the mercies and love of God! Then add to this what we are told about baptism. We are made new. Romans 6:4, "We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a <u>new</u> life." Then we read 2 Cor. 5:17-If anyone is in Christ, he is a <u>new creation."</u> We can truly rejoice in a new day and in a new life in Christ!

This newness is not just celebrated once in a life time or even once a year-(like our New Year Holiday) Martin Luther tells us to celebrate this newness each day. We read in the small Catechism under part four of Baptism—

What does such baptizing with water indicate?

It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all the sins and evil desires, and that a <u>New man should daily</u> emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

Take this New Year as an opportunity to reflect on the fact that you are a New Creation in Christ Jesus and celebrate by listening to Paul's admonition. Eph. 4:24 *Put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness.* 



#### What you need:

- Gallon-size zip bags
- New socks
- Hand warmers
- Bus fare or tokens
- Bottled water
- Nonperishable food
- Toiletries and firstaid items
- Paper and markers

#### What you do:

- 1. Gather supplies, using the ideas above. Fill bags to make care packages.
- 2. Write notes or draw pictures for recipients, placing one in each bag.
- 3. Zip bags and keep them in a vehicle to distribute. Or deliver them right away to people in need (or to sick or homebound people, nursing home residents, a homeless shelter and so on).
- 4. Pray that God will use your gifts to help and encourage each recipient.


# ANNUAL VOTERS MEETING
