As I begin writing this month's newsletter article, I am looking out the window to see piles of snow in the parking lot and most of the yard is still covered with the white stuff. With so much going on today with politics, our leaders, and the world around us, we may wonder with some concern just what will happen next? Of course, while we may be anxious about the future, as Christians, we know how wonderful it is that God has provided us with an outlet to bring our concern directly to Him.

It's called prayer.

God hasn't promised that world tension will subside, or every leader will instantly become pure and righteous if we pray, but He still commands us to do it. God wants us to pray not only for our leaders, but for other nations too. The Bible says, "I urge then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercessions and thanksgiving be made for all people...and all who are in high positions" (1 Timothy 2:1-2). This is powerful because as we read in Proverbs 21:1, "The king's heart is in the hand of the Lord, like the rivers of water He turns it wherever He wishes."

Still, even though we know that it's our duty to pray, we may wonder if prayer applied to these situations can really make a difference? After all, we've been praying a long time and the world is still evil (a great answer to a Bible Study question when you're stuck). Here at St. John's, we pray for our nation all the time, but the country still seems to be plagued with conflict and injustice. Is anything really changing?

The answer is plain. We only need to consider how much worse the world would be if we didn't pray. What if we simply gave in and gave up? We may never know what impact our prayers are having, but we can be certain that God is still at work in response to our prayers.

There's no doubt that the devil is at work in the world—but so is God! And someday, as God has promised, He will intervene, and Christ will come again to establish His kingdom. In the meantime, don't become discouraged by what you see in the news and so many of today's social media sites. The Bible says, "The secret power of lawlessness (the devil) is already at work; but the one (the Holy Spirit) who holds it back will continue to do so" (2 Thessalonians 2:7).

God knows what's next. He sees the big picture, and He cares how you're feeling. Just think how many times He has been walking next to us, caring for us as we question the future. Sure, the world can be chaotic, but God offers a peace that transcends this.

As Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid' (John 14:27). That kind of peace doesn't come from one person in power, or a piece of legislation. It's a peace that begins in your heart, and with your prayers.

Armed with this truth, continue to pray for those to whom God has given authority. Pray for our nation, our president, congress, judges, pastors, Christian leaders, and others who advise them.

It is true that we are still living in dangerous times but God has always been—and still is AT WORK. And He alone is our hope.

Stay strong in Christ.
