Dear Saints,

Here, in a familiar passage to us, Paul exhorts young Timothy to continue in what he has learned from the sacred Scriptures, "Which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus." These words that were written for young Timothy are just as true for us today; we are to continue in what we have learned from Scripture. This means being in God's Holy Word each and every day, continuously meditating on it.

We are to be well acquainted with the Word of God and not simply passing observers. Just hearing a small portion of it read on Sunday morning is not enough. We are to be in it daily. This requires work and discipline. It requires a plan to be in place and for you to stick to it. If daily Scripture reading is not yet a habit for you, start small. Better to start small and form the habit than to take a large bite and burn out in a week. Begin with just a few verses and then slowly work up from there. Anything is better than nothing.

Do you have a daily commute to work or an upcoming trip? Download the ESV Bible app and listen to the Bible as you drive. There is a great benefit to receiving God's Word in a variety of ways: through reading it silently, through reading it out loud, and through listening to it. With today's technology, there are more ways than ever to read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest God's Word.


FAITH LUTHERAN'S 75th ANNIVERSARY SERVICE:


