LIFE THOUGHTS IN THE CHURCH YEAR: – Did Nehemiah’s people weep for gladness or grief at the Word of the Lord (8:9)? In addition, we will archive all the recordings of streams (Bible study & worship services) on the website so they can be viewed any time.

2. On Vimeo

Vimeo is a professional video service that will house all our church’s streamed videos.

Vimeo is an American video hosting, sharing, and services platform provider that focuses on the delivery of high-definition video across a range of devices. They have a range of services that are specifically offered to churches and organizations. They do not generate revenue via users. They are NOT a social media site.

ANYONE can view Vimeo videos without creating an account (unlike Facebook).
