Welcome to each of you, guests and members in person and online. It is good to have you worship with us. May God bless your worship today.

We, along with many churches throughout the land, commemorate today with special services of thanksgiving and praise to God for preserving the pure doctrine within the Church. The actual day of Reformation is October 31, because on that day in 1517 Martin Luther nailed 95 theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg. This document dealt with the error of indulgences. This one act did not constitute the whole of the Reformation, it was one in a series of events that began a movement of renewal in the Church, and a return to the teaching of the Bible – mainly that we are saved by grace through faith apart from the works of the law solely through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

Martin Luther was not the first or only Reformer. Several men before him had died for their faith and their efforts. However, God saw fit to let Martin Luther live and to let him lead the Church back to God's Word. For this we praise God! We and many other people are Christians today as a direct result of the Reformation which has affected all church denominations, not only the Lutherans.

The Epistle Lesson: Romans 3:19-28

¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin. ²¹But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: ²³for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins.

²⁶ It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. ²⁷ Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸ For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.
