Sermon Outline: WATCHING AND WAITING – Mark 13:32-37

(Jesus said,) "If he comes suddenly, do not let him find you sleeping.

What I say to you, I say to everyone: Watch!"

Introduction: We spend a lot of time waiting!

- 1. The people of Israel had waited a very long time for a promised Savior
 - a. Often they wondered if God had forgotten about them
 - b. Nothing seemed to be happening
 - c. Each time they were hopeful, the ended up being disappointed
- 2. Jesus' disciples were hopeful that he was the Messiah
 - a. They had heard that the kingdom was about to happen
 - b. Jesus spoke of the love of God and his promise about to be revealed
 - c. Jesus performed miracles and forgave sins
- 3. What are we waiting for?
 - a. Do we believe that God has already come to us?
 - b. What are we "called" to do while we are waiting?
 - c. Build yourselves up! Build others up!

Conclusion: Keep watch and be alert! But while we wait, God uses us to tell others that he has already come in the life, death and resurrection of Christ!
