- 1. The Old Testament pointed ahead to a Savior
  - a. From the family tree of Adam, Abraham and David
  - b. The Savior would be like a branch, or a sprout
  - c. When the Savior came, he would be hard to see
- 2. Jesus was born at Christmas
  - a. How many people knew the Savior had come?
  - b. The Branch grew up and called people to believe in Him
  - c. They killed the Branch
- 3. Jesus asks you to look closely at what Christmas means
  - a. A Branch grows in your life to be your God and Savior
  - b. It is hard to see sometimes and Satan wants to cloud your vision
- c. The life-giving Branch wants you to have life
