<sup>6</sup> For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. <sup>7</sup> For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die— <sup>8</sup> but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. <sup>9</sup> Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. <sup>10</sup> For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. <sup>11</sup> More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

# The Gospel Reading: Mark 8:27-38

<sup>27</sup> And Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi. And on the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" <sup>28</sup> And they told him, "John the Baptist; and others say, Elijah; and others, one of the prophets." <sup>29</sup> And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him, "You are the Christ." <sup>30</sup> And he strictly charged them to tell no one about him. <sup>31</sup> And he began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes and be killed, and after three days rise again. <sup>32</sup> And he said this plainly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. <sup>33</sup> But turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man." <sup>34</sup> And calling the crowd to him with his disciples, he said to them, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. <sup>35</sup> For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel's will save it. <sup>36</sup> For what does it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? <sup>37</sup> For what can a man give in return for his soul? <sup>38</sup> For whoever is ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of him will the Son of Man also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

• Lenten Worship, 7:00 p.m. – "Return From Betrayal": In the book of Joel, the prophet paints a vivid picture of the coming judgment of God, the day of the Lord. But right in the middle of this frightening portent of judgment, we find a tender invitation from the Lord: "Return to the Lord your God for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster" (Joel 2:13b). During this season of Lent, we will consider this "call to return," and how it played out for those who walked alongside Christ during His Passion, and for us today.

Judas appears in the Garden of Gethsemane and betrays Jesus into the "hands of lawless men" (Acts 2:23). We will explore the theme of betrayal, specifically the ways that we betray one another and Jesus through our denials and rejection of the faith. We live in a culture that prides itself on rejecting the morality that Jesus taught, and we are pressured to betray Jesus in order to fit in. Whether it is failing to acknowledge our faith lest our friends shun us or going against our conscience to embrace our own sinful urges, it is too easy to turn away from God by betraying Jesus. But Jesus does not shrink back from the betrayal, does not seek to avoid the consequences. Instead, He steps right up to it. When the soldiers declare that they are seeking Jesus, He responds simply, "I am He" (John 18:6). More to the point, He ensures the release

of His followers: "If you seek Me, let these men go" (John 18:8). That is exactly what happens on the cross, as Jesus steps up to own our betrayals and ensures that all who believe in Him will be freed.

LIFE THOUGHTS IN THE CHURCH YEAR: Jesus delights to invite the Samaritan woman into His fellowship and forgiveness for her sordid past (John 4:13-18). So He has received each of us, notwithstanding our mistakes and failures. And so He insists we know the joy and hope of explicitly articulating the same grace to any who suffer the guilt and grief of aborting their own children.
