SERVICE NOTE: Today is Trinity Sunday, a day on which we are refreshed in the Trinitarian faith that we profess. We use an ancient Creed today called the Athanasian Creed.

Luther called this Creed, with its emphasis on the doctrine of the Trinity, the grandest production of the Church since Apostolic times.

Its origin is obscure. It probably originated in North Africa later in the fifth century. This Creed used the word "catholic" to describe the faith we profess. This word does not denote a denomination, but rather means "universal," in the sense that it is the faith that Christians share. This Creed uses rather strong language because it was refuting many false doctrines and teachings of its day. Those same heresies still exist. There is also a strong emphasis on works. Works are the evidence of saving – flowing through and from faith in Christ

The Gospel Reading: John 3:1-17

3:1 Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. ² This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." 3 Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." ⁴ Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" ⁵ Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. 6 That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.⁷ Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' ⁸ The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." 9 Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" 10 Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things? ¹¹ Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen, but you do not receive our testimony. 12 If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things? ¹³ No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴ And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, 15 that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. ¹⁶ "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

The Athanasian Creed, p. 53

- Whosoever will be saved, before all things it is necessary that he hold the catholic faith [i.e., universal, Christian].
- Which faith unless every one do keep whole and undefiled, without doubt he shall perish everlastingly.
- And the catholic faith is this: that we worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in Unity, Neither confounding the Persons, nor dividing the Substance.
- For there is one Person of the Father; another of the Son; and another of the Holy Ghost.
- But the Godhead of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, is all one; the Glory equal, the Majesty coeternal.
- Such as the Father is; such is the Son; and such is the Holy Ghost.
- The Father uncreate; the Son uncreate; and the Holy Ghost uncreate.
- The Father incomprehensible; the Son incomprehensible; and the Holy Ghost
- incomprehensible. The Father eternal; the Son eternal; and the Holy Ghost eternal.
- And yet they are not three Eternals; but one Eternal.
- As there are not three Uncreated; nor three Incomprehensibles, but one Uncreated; and one Incomprehensible.
- So likewise the Father is almighty; the Son almighty; and the Holy Ghost almighty.
- And yet they are not three Almighties; but one Almighty.
- So the Father is God; the Son is God; and the Holy Ghost is God.
- And yet they are not three Gods; but one God.
- So likewise the Father is Lord; the Son Lord; and the Holy Ghost Lord.
- And yet not three Lords; but one Lord.
- For like as we are compelled by the Christian verity; to acknowledge every Person by Himself to be God and Lord;
- So are we forbidden by the catholic religion; to say, There are three Gods, or three Lords. The Father is made of none: neither created, nor begotten.
- The Son is of the Father alone; not made, nor created; but begotten.
- The Holy Ghost is of the Father and of the Son; neither made, nor created, nor begotten; but proceeding.
- So there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Ghost, not three Holy Ghosts.
- And in this Trinity none is before, or after another; none is greater, or less than another
- But the whole three Persons are coeternal, and coequal, so that in all things, as is aforesaid; the Unity in Trinity, and the Trinity in Unity, is to be worshiped.
- He therefore that will be saved, must thus think of the Trinity.
- Furthermore, it is necessary to everlasting salvation that he also believe faithfully the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- For the right Faith is that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is God and Man;
- God, of the of the Substance of the Father; begotten before the worlds; and Man, of the substance of His Mother, born in the world.
- Perfect God; and perfect Man, of a reasonable soul and human flesh subsisting.
- Equal to the Father, as touching his Godhead and inferior to the Father as touching His manhood.
- Who although He be God and Man; yet He is not two, but one Christ.
- One; not by conversion of the Godhead into flesh; but by taking the manhood into God.
- One altogether; not by confusion of Substance, but by unity of Person.
- For as the reasonable soul and flesh is one man; so God and Man is one Christ;
- Who suffered for our salvation; descended into hell; rose again the third day from the dead.
- He ascended into heaven, He sitteth on the right hand of the Father, God Almighty, from whence He will come to judge the quick and the dead.
- At whose coming all men will rise again with their bodies and shall give an account for their own works.
- And they that have done good shall go into life everlasting; and they that have done evil, into everlasting fire.
- This is the catholic faith; which except a man believe faithfully and firmly, he cannot be saved.


