SERVICE NOTE: Today is Holy Trinity Sunday, a day on which we are refreshed in the Trinitarian faith that we profess. We use an abbreviated reading of the ancient Creed today, called the Athanasian Creed.

Luther called this Creed, with its emphasis on the doctrine of the Trinity, the grandest production of the church since apostolic times. Its origin is obscure. It probably originated in North Africa later in the fifth century,

The Creed emphasizes faith in the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

God is three persons, yet one God, and Jesus is true God himself become human, but still Divine. This is what makes one a true Christian.

This Creed in its entire form rejects any false teaching about Jesus and the Biblical picture of God as Trinity, Three in One.

## Old Testament Reading Deuteronomy 4:32-40

"For ask now of the days that are past, which were before you, since the day that God created man on the earth, and ask from one end of heaven to the other, whether such a great thing as this has ever happened or was ever heard of. Did any people ever hear the voice of a god speaking out of the midst of the fire, as you have heard, and still live? Or has any god ever attempted to go and take a nation for himself from the midst of another nation, by trials, by signs, by wonders, and by war, by a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, and by great deeds of terror, all of which the Lord your God did for you in Egypt before your eyes? To you it was shown, that you might know that the Lord is God; there is no other besides him. Out of heaven he let you hear his voice, that he might discipline you. And on earth he let you see his great fire, and you heard his words out of the midst of the fire. And because he loved your fathers and chose their offspring after them and brought you out of Egypt with his own presence, by his great power, driving out before you nations greater and mightier than you, to bring you in, to give you their land for an inheritance, as it is this day, know therefore today, and lay it to your heart, that the Lord is God in heaven above and on the earth beneath; there is no other. Therefore you shall keep his statutes and his commandments, which I command you today, that it may go well with you and with your children after you, and that you may prolong your days in the land that the Lord your God is giving you for all time."

## **Epistle Reading** Romans 11:33-36

O the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments, and his ways past finding out! For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who has been his counsellor? Or who has given something to Him, and God will be in his debt? For of him, and through him, and to him, are all things: to whom be glory forever. Amen.

#### **The Gradual** (The congregation responds with "Halleluiahs!")

P: BLESSED are You, O Lord, Who beholds the deep: and Who lives between the cherubim. Blessed are You, O Lord, in the firmament of heaven: and greatly to be praised, and glorified, and highly exalted forever. Blessed are You, O Lord God of our fathers: and greatly to be praised and glorified forever. Hallelujah!

As the Gospel reading is announced, the congregation sings... Glory be to Thee, O Lord!

## The Holy Gospel John 8:48-59

The Jews answered him, "Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and have a demon?" Jesus answered, "I do not have a demon, but I honor my Father, and you dishonor me. Yet I do not seek my own glory; there is One who seeks it, and he is the judge. Truly, truly, I say to you, if anyone keeps my word, he will never see death." The Jews said to him, "Now we know that you have a demon! Abraham died, as did the prophets, yet you say, 'If anyone keeps my word, he will never taste death.' Are you greater than our father Abraham, who died? And the prophets died! Who do you make yourself out to be?" Jesus answered, "If I glorify myself, my glory is nothing. It is my Father who glorifies me, of whom you say, 'He is our God.' But you have not known him. I know him. If I were to say that I do not know him, I would be a liar like you, but I do know him and I keep his word. Your father Abraham rejoiced that he would see my day. He saw it and was glad." So the Jews said to him, "You are not yet fifty years old, and have you seen Abraham?" Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I am." So they picked up stones to throw at him, but Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple.

The Gospel ended, the congregation sings...` Praise be to Thee, O Christ!

**Athanasian Creed** (shortened form, spoken responsively)

- P: Whoever wants to be saved must, above all, hold the true Christian faith. Now this is the true faith, that we worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God without confusing the persons nor separating the divine being.
- C: For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is still another; but there is one God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, all equal in glory and eternal in majesty.
- P: It is necessary that one also believe faithfully that our Lord Jesus Christ became human. This is the true faith, that we believe and confess, that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is both God and human, but is not two Christ's but one, both divine and human in one person.
- C: God, begotten before all worlds from the being of the Father, and human, born in the world from the being of his mother, perfect God and perfect human, with a rational soul and a human body.
- P: For just as soul and body are one in a human being, so God and human are one in Christ,
- C: who suffered for our salvation, descended to the dead, rose from the dead on the third day, ascended into heaven, sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty and will come to judge the living and the dead.
- P: Jesus Christ, the Son, sits at the right hand of God the Father, and together with the Holy Spirit works together,
- C: One God in three persons, to work faith in us to believe that we will rise again and live with him forever. This is the one true faith.

Sermon Hymn: TLH #245 "God Loved the World So That He Gave"

God loved the world so that He gave His only Son the lost to save That all who would in Him believe Should everlasting life receive.

**Sermon**: "God's Wonderful Mystery" – Deuteronomy 4:39-40 Introduction – There are plenty of things that are "mysteries"

- 1. Are we staisfied with allowing God to be a mystery?
  - a. We are content with God when things are OK
  - b. God is God even if we don't understand Him
  - c. Mystery or not, God wants us to acknowledge Him
- 2. When we are young, much of life is a mystery
  - a. We simply accept things as children
  - b. We grow up and question things not understood
  - c. Often we don't even acknowledge that God is there
- 3. It is not a mystery what God has done
  - a. He created us and wants us to have life
  - b. He sent Jesus, our God and Lord, to live and die
  - c. Together with the Spirit, we are given life and love

Conclusion - What a wonderful mystery that God loves us so much - the Father, Son and Holy Spirit!
