Ringing Of The Bell – Prelude – Words of Welcome

Thou Holy Light, Guide Divine, Oh cause the Word of Life to shine!
Teach us to know our God aright And call Him Father with delight.

That we in living faith abide, In Him, our Lord, with all our might confide.

Thou holy Fire, Comfort true, Grant us the will Thy work to do And in Thy service to abide; Let trials turn us not aside. Lord, by Thy pow'r prepare each heart And to our weakness strength impart That bravely here we may contend Thro' life and death to Thee, our Lord, ascend. Hallelujah! Amen.

Prayer for Pentecost (spoken together)

Lord God, who taught the hearts of your faithful people by sending to them the light of your Holy Spirit: grant us by the same Spirit to have a right judgment in all things and evermore to rejoice in his holy comfort; through the merits of Christ Jesus our Savior. Strengthen your children with the gift of faith, revive your Church with the breath of love, and renew the face of the earth in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, together with the Father and the Son, now and forever. Amen

Confession Of Sins

P: You who are loved by God, come near to Him with a true heart and confess our sins unto God, our Father, asking Him in the Name of the Lord, Jesus Christ, to grant us forgiveness.

ALL: Eternal God, I confess to You that I have tried to do right and still fail to accomplish Your will and daily I have also gone my own way. I confess that I have tried to hide from You, that I have done wrong. I have lived for myself. Often I have refused to bear the troubles of others and have turned from my neighbor in need. Too often I have ignored the pain of the world and have passed by the hungry, the poor, and the oppressed. I have grieved Your Holy Spirit by trying to justify my actions and attitudes and fled from Your revealed will. Lord, in mercy, for the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, forgive my sin and free me from selfishness. Send Your Spirit to strengthen me that I can choose Your will and obey Your commandments; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, my Lord. Amen.

P: Sons and daughters of God, be of glad heart, God has forgiven your sins for the sake of the innocent sufferings and death of His beloved Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord. So go in peace and dedicate your life to His glory! In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. C: **Amen. It is so!**

The Old Testament Lesson: Ezekiel 37:1-14

The hand of the LORD was upon me, and he brought me out in the Spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of the valley; it was full of bones. And he led me around among them, and behold, there were very many on the surface of the valley, and behold, they were very dry. And he said to me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" And I answered, "O Lord GOD, you know." Then he said to me, "Prophesy over these bones, and say to them, O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: Behold, I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. And I will lay sinews upon you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live, and you shall know that I am the LORD." So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I prophesied, there was a sound, and behold, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone. And I looked, and behold, there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them. But there was no breath in them. Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the breath; prophesy, son of man, and say to the breath, Thus says the Lord GOD: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe on these slain, that they may live." So I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived and stood on their feet, an exceedingly great army. Then he said to me, "Son of man, these bones are the whole house of Israel. Behold, they say, 'Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we are indeed cut off.' Therefore prophesy, and say to them, Thus says the Lord GOD: Behold, I will open your graves and raise you from your graves, O my people. And I will bring you into the land of Israel. And you shall know that I am the LORD, when I open your graves, and raise you from your graves, O my people. And I will put my Spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you in your own land. Then you shall know that I am the LORD; I have spoken, and I will do it, declares the LORD."

P: This is the word of the Lord. C: **Thanks be to God.**

The Epistle Lesson: Acts 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them: "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. For these people are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel: "And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and magnificent day. And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

P: This is the word of the Lord. C: **Thanks be to God.**

The Profession Of Faith: (Please stand)

Luther's Explanation of the Third Article of the Apostles' Creed which describes the work of the Holy Spirit. I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him, but the Holy Spirit has called me by the gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctifies and keeps me in the true faith; even as He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith; in which Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all sins to me and all believers, and will at the last day raise up me and all the dead, and give unto me and all believers in Christ eternal life. This is most certainly true. Amen.

Holy Gospel: John 15:26-27; 16:7-15

"When the Counselor has come, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth, who proceeds from the Father, he will testify about me. You will also testify, because you have been with me from the beginning.

... I tell you the truth: It is to your advantage that I go away; for if I don't go away, the Counselor won't come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you. When he has come, he will convict the world about sin, about righteousness, and about judgment; about sin, because they don't believe in me; about righteousness, because I am going to my Father, and you won't see me any more; about judgment, because the prince of this world has been judged.

"I still have many things to tell you, but you can't bear them now. However, when he, the Spirit of truth, has come, he will guide you into all truth, for he will not speak from himself; but whatever he hears, he will speak. He will declare to you things that are coming. He will glorify me, for he will take from what is mine and will declare it to you. All things that the Father has are mine; therefore I said that he takes of mine and will declare it to you.

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

C: Praise be to You, O Christ. (Please be seated)

Sermon - "What God Sees" Ezekiel 37:1-6

Introduction – People don't always see themselves as they really are

- 1. We live in this world
 - a. We see ourselves in the mirror
 - b. We observe the world around us
 - c. God sometimes appears to be in the background
- 2. God sees us quite differently
 - a. Ezekiel was given a "look" at what God sees
 - b. Without God in us we and our world are dead
 - c. The Spirit must be in us and with us to give us life
- 3. When Christ is in us we look quite different
 - a. The Holy Spirit alone can give us this new look
 - b. When Christ is in us, we are eternal
 - c. God's desire is to put life back in a dead world

Conclusion – The Holy Spirit helps us see through the eyes of faith
