Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy.

Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.

The Gospel of Luke and the Book of Acts

Luke wrote the longest book in the New Testament Gospel of Luke & the Book of Acts.

Luke was a companion to Paul. Acts 16:10-17

The Baptism of Jesus – Luke 3:21-22 (All four Gospels)

God Will Respond – The Persistent Widow. Luke 18:1-8

Similarities of Books of Luke & Acts

Both books are addressed to Theophilus.

Same style

Same Greek

Both reflect interest in Gentiles.

Both emphasize the work of the Holy Spirit

Day 3 – General Epistles - 1

Hebrews is a letter concerning Jesus, the Christ. He is the final revelation of God, superior to the prophets and angels. It speaks of the priesthood and the new covenant.

Hebrews 1:1-14

James speaks of the endurance of testing and temptation, faith and works, self-will and God's will, and the restoration of an erring brother.

James 1:12, 2:14-18, 5:11

Day 3 – General Epistles - 2

I Peter reveals that salvation is a glorious heavenly inheritance. He speaks of a plea for holiness and submission to authority.

1 Peter 1:15-16, 3:9 – Be you holy; for I am holy.

II Peter speaks of knowledge grounded in faith in Jesus Christ. As God judged false prophets in the past, God will judge false prophets of today and the future.

2 Peter 2:1 – “False prophets also among the people.”

I John warns of the antichrist and those who were associated with the Christian community who have fled the fellowship of believers and have denounced the Christian church.

1 John 2:18, 22 – many antichrists

II John warns of those who deny the humanity of Christ Jesus and seek to spread their ideas.

2 John 1:7 – “Many deceivers are entered in the world....”

Day 3 – General Epistles – 3

I John warns of the antichrist and those who were associated with the Christian community who have fled the fellowship of believers and have denounced the Christian church.

1 John 2:18, 22 – many antichrists

II John warns of those who deny the humanity of Christ Jesus and seek to spread their ideas.

2 John 1:7 – “Many deceivers are entered in the world....”

Day 3 – General Epistles – 4

III John expresses the Apostles desire to aide Gaius in handling a delicate situation. Gaius is a loyal friend of the Apostle John.

3 John 1:1-2 – Prosper and be in health!

Jude senses the urgent need to alert his fellow saints of the threat posed by false teachers. He affirms that their doom is sure.

Jude 1:3-5 – Contend for the faith, destroyed them that believed not.
