Today, you will write a **hybrid imaginative response** about **The Choice**.

A choice can take many forms. It may involve selecting between two paths, but it can also be emotional, moral, cultural, personal, or symbolic. Some choices are made freely, while others are shaped by pressure, circumstance, or expectation. Some lead to opportunity and growth, while others bring sacrifice, regret, or uncertainty.

Choices often change the way people see themselves, others, and the world around them. They can reveal courage, test relationships, shape identity, and deepen understanding. Even the smallest choice can leave a lasting mark.

In your writing, explore the significance of **The Choice**. You may consider a choice connected to identity, belonging, memory, change, responsibility, or self-discovery.

Think carefully about what **The Choice** symbolises in your response. It may be literal or metaphorical, personal or collective, ordinary or extraordinary.
