to find our own.



Alzafar, as we move throughout the year, I am encouraged to see and hear of all the great things we are doing as an organization. Please continue to put the fraternity and philanthropy at the forefront of your efforts, and we are bound to succeed. I have a couple of items to address in my article this month. The first has to do with approaching ideas and expectations concerning Shrine events. The second will assist the nobility in an understanding of events to come as we move through this year.

Events put on at the Shrine have little chance for success if we try to accomplish them overnight. Successful undertakings are not thought up as a whim and then implemented the next day. They come from days and sometimes months and even years of thoughtful planning, careful consideration, and strategic application. Please understand, when you have an idea, the onus is on you, and you should not simply approach the Divan and say, "Here is my idea, and you need to do it!" As the idea person, the expectation is that "you" have somewhat developed the idea. It would be best to propose which side of our organization will benefit from the concept and put a business plan together to implement the idea. As Illustrious Sir Eric DeWalt would say, "One man can make a difference, but one man can not do it alone! We need you to continue developing your ideas and assisting the nobility in ensuring those ideas aim for success. For example, a few Nobles had the idea of jumping into a pool of cold water and calling it a Winter Plunge. They then thought about how they could raise funds for our philanthropy. They developed a strategy that would include outside sources in their fundraising efforts. Finally, after several years, they raised \$10,000 for Shriners Hospitals. Well done, gentlemen!

As for the events to come for the year, at this point, we have contracts on their way for Alzafar's primary fundraiser for the year. The expectation is to try something new and to grow it over time. I speak about our proposed "Sportsman's Extravaganza," we have a band on board to perform for this new November project. In conjunction, we've started sanctioning a BBQ cook-off, and we have the list of raffle items and agreements in place with the organization that will be providing more than 60 firearms, gift cards, and outdoor items for the event. As a sidebar, in addition to our November extravaganza, we have finally received a contract for consideration on the Carden Circus. At the writing of this article just a week ago, January 31st, the proposed Circus contract arrived via email. Your Board of Directors and the Temple Attorney have that contract in hand. As a Divan, with the advice of counsel, we are diligently reviewing it to determine if it is in the best interest of Alzafar to go forward.

Happy March, Alzafar; I can't believe a third of the year has almost passed. I've been working diligently on several new fundraisers for Alzafar and the Transportation Fund. The first fund-raiser will be the third annual Fishing for Kids in July after the Imperial Session. The proceeds of this event will once again be given over to our hospital transportation fund. I'm waiting for the fishery to release the red snapper season dates before posting the actual date.

The next event will be held in the Shrine Auditorium on Saturday, June 18th. Martinez Enter-tainment will produce a Lucha Libre (Mexican Wrestling) event; doors will open to VIPs only at 6pm. VIPs will have a meet and greet and get autographs from performers. The first card will start at 8. In early April, tickets and Paid Parking will be posted online on a ticket web page. Tickets will start at \$35 and up to \$75 for special VIP access. There will be only 4 dedicated VIP tables. The 4 VIP tables will have seating



for 8. They will be available for a contribution of \$1000 a table and assigned a waitress for adult beverages. Proceeds from this event will also go toward Alzafar's Transportation Fund.

On August 20th, we will have our Alzafar Shrine Ceremonial. More details will follow, and rest assured it will be like no traditional Shrine Ceremonial. I'm working to make this more memo-rable for the new nobles. The day will probably not start until 1-2, as the Hot Sands privacy is no longer allowed.

I've decided that there will NOT be a chili cook-off held at Alzafar's main campus or at camp this year as produced by the High Priest and Prophet. I've evaluated the past events spanning several years, and there haven't been new nobles made at the event. There will be a Texas Country Concert held at the Alzafar Shrine Pavilion this year. Speaking of futures, we are looking forward to this year's TSA and the Texas Shrine Homebrewers Association annual competition. This year's styles for entry and the brewer are:


