

Hospital Report: Our mission of helping Children is going strong. In February, we raised \$53,842, with the help of the ticket sales for the upcoming Hospital Gala on May 4th. Based on our bank balance after the event, the Assistant Rabban will decide how much money is needed for the Transportation Fund and how much we can give directly to the Galveston Hospital. The goal is to hopefully split the revenue 50/50. Our expenses for the month were \$24,402, as we transported 41 patients, each with a parent. We also helped with three air flights of burn patients to the Galveston Hospital. The Hospital Corps also had a busy month driving some of the patients to appointments in Houston.

Shriner Lounge: We have converted Room 4 into a Shrine Lounge. The Lounge is available to any Shriner or lady for meetings, games, parties, luncheons/dinners, or just relaxing. We

German Beef Stew

From the Kitchen of the wonderful Hilda Ploetz!

- 1 ½ Lbs. cut stew meat
- 1 Lg apple, peel and shred
- ½ onion, sliced
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 sm bay leaf
- 4 Tbs cornstarch
- 1/4 tsp Kitchen Bouquet
- 2 Tbs cooking oil
- 1 med carrot shredded
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/3 cup dry red wine
- 2 beef bouillon cubes
- 1/8 tsp dried thyme
- 1/4 cup water

Brown meat in oil. Add carrots, apple, onion, 1/2 cup water, wine, garlic, bouillon cubes, bay leaf, and thyme. Cover and cook over low heat for 2 hours or until beef is tender. Remove bay leaf. Combine cornstarch and 1/4 cup of water, add to beef mixture. Cook and stir until thickened. Stir in kitchen bouquet. Serve over noodles, preferably Spaetzle!

Fall is here, the season of beginnings and rebirth. A time for all things bright and light, luscious and tasty and I thought I would give you a couple of options to look for on your outings.

Lagers - they are plentiful and refreshing. Lagers are a type of beer brewed and conditioned at low temperature. Lagers can be pale, amber, or dark. Pale lager is the most widely consumed and commercially available style of beer. Lagers go far beyond what is our typical domestic: Budweiser, Miller Lite, Coors and Lonestar.

Saison-Saison is a pale ale that is highly carbonated, fruity, spicy, and often bottle conditioned. It's a style that allows brewers to interpret and experiment, resulting in a diverse range of flavors and characteristics. Originally brewed on small farms, saison was meant to be enjoyed by farmhands during the summer months and last until harvest. These seasonal beers have a rustic flavor profile, reflecting their farmhouse origins. They varied from one brewer to the next, using whatever local ingredients were available.

IPA- now this category is all over the place with different taste profiles, flavors and ABV, depending on where it is brewed. Today's IPAs are certainly nothing like their predecessors, which would have originally been brewed with East Kent Goldings. Instead, today's creations are a marvel to behold, containing just about any imaginable hop available, grown anywhere they can survive. (American Craft Brewer)

Now these are just 3 styles to be on the look out for going into the Spring season, enjoy your experience in sampling new styles and flavors.

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

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Alzafar Hospital Corp

Historically Alzafar Hospital Corps had its beginning in 1965. Robert O'Connor, Potentate delegated several Shriners to form appropriate committees to look into Shrinedom's True Work, the care of crippled; and burned children. The success of these committees in 1965 led to the formation, of Alzafar's Crippled and Burned Children Program. The Hospital Corps was born March 1, 1966 with 30 Charter members and one station wagon to transport children. A second station wagon was added June 1, 1966 to transport the increasing number of children to and from hospitals. The early vehicles were provided from proceeds of the Shrine Charity

Horse Show and yearly a new van was provided for several years. Initially there were 22 Shrine Children's Hospitals with 2 of those being in Texas, Houston and Galveston. The name was changed from "crippled" children to "Shriners" children's hospitals and currently there remains one hospital in Galveston. The current Hospital Corps continues to grow with members and continues driving children to both Galveston Hospital and specialty clinics in Houston which are affiliated with the Shriners. We now have (3) 7 passenger vans and one 12 passenger van used for both transporting patients and pulling the Fez float in parades. As of 2016, Hospital Corps drivers have driven in excess of 5 million (5,000,000) miles with no significant accidents or injuries and these figures are currently being updated. There are now 32 members in the Hospital Corps but all members are not drivers. As is true with many organizations our members are getting older and no longer able to drive. A recent survey of our membership shows that we have lost 42 members since 2000 to the Black camel. If you have never been to a Shrine Children's Hospital, contact one of our unit members or Irma Alvarez in the office about riding on a trip or riding the Fez float in a parade. We meet the third Tuesday of each month in room 5 at 1900 hours. 
Shotgun AKA Smokin' Clays

By the time you read this the Shotgun Unit will have already competed at the TSSSA Mid-Winter Shoot in Lubbock, TX. We took 21 shooters to the competition including a squad of 4 Ladies. A big shout out to Ladies Gay Smitha, Karen Myre, Mandy Anderson and Denise LaLoge. The way they were breakin' clays during our practices, I'm sure they'll be high up on the leaderboard in Lubbock. I'll be sure to provide all the results of the Mid-Winter Shoot in next month's Achbar. Our goal is to bring home some hardware for the unit trophy cabinet and be in the running for the President's Trophy which will be awarded at TSA to the best shooting Temple after combining the results of the Mid-Winter and TSA shoot in June.

In a previous edition of the Achbar I explained the basics of sporting clays, one of the three major disciplines of competitive clay target shooting. The other two being skeet and trap. This month I'll explain the basics of skeet shooting which is also included in many of our competitions.

The game of skeet was invented to simulate the action of bird hunting. That's why the clay targets are also called clay pigeons. So, the firearm of choice is a good quality over and under or semi-automatic shotgun. Skeet uses the same clay targets as trap, and is usually shot in squads of five shooters. At its most basic, a round of skeet involves one box of 25 shotgun shells per shooter, which will be fired from eight positions, or stations, numbered consecutively from left to right in a semi-circle around the skeet field. Two trap houses are used in skeet to throw the clay targets, a "high house" at the left of the field and a "low house" at the right. High-house targets are thrown from about 10 feet above the ground, moving to the shooter's right. Low-house targets move in the opposite direction thrown from a point about three feet off the ground. The illustration shows the layout of typical skeet field.

The shooters begin a round at Station 1 in front of the High House and progress around the arc to Station 7 in front of the Low House, ending at Station 8 exactly at the middle between the two houses. Some stations require shooting single targets (one clay pigeon launched at a time), with other stations requiring you to shoot single targets as well as doubles where two targets are launched at the same time. A perfect round of skeet requires breaking all 25 targets presented during the round. And there is a long-standing tradition when a shooter completes his/her first perfect round, they must give their hat up to the team and allow them to throw it up in the air so everyone can take a shot at it. It's then returned to owner (with hundreds of holes through it) as another coveted item to be displayed in their trophy case.




