The Dolphin Express runs 5 to 12 hour offshore trips as well as private charter trips

Rise and Shrine

As promised, here is the info for Alzafar Fishing for Kids. The trip is a lot of fun and a great way to build lasting memories with your children for us all. The Trip will be on July 18th at 6:00 am. You must be at the dock no later than 5:30 am located at 300 W. Cotter Ave. Port Aransas, Tx. 78373. The cost for the 5-hour fishing trip will be \$75.00 per person. The fishing vessel will be the Dolphin Express, a Coast Guard inspected vessel accommodating a limit of 66 persons, not including crew. The targeted species of fish will be Red Snapper, and everyone will come home with a limit of two fish.

The average weight is 12-15lbs per fish. The outfitter provides all bait and tackle. No outside food or drinks are allowed; they will have the galley open for drinks and snacks for purchase. The ship's galley operates as a cash-only enterprise come with that hard currency. Suppose you book and must cancel, with regrets (Sort of), your payment will automatically go to Alzafar's Shriners Hospitals for Children Transportation fund. It has been an accounting issue in the past. We will have to rebook someone in your place to attempt to fill the boat for this fundraiser. Full payment will ensure your fishing spot(s).

Additionally, the dock will have a fish cleaning service for .40-.60 per pound, or you can clean your catch across the street at the marina fish house. Also, on the day of the fishing trip, there will be a big fish (by weight and not length) pot. \$10 per person if you want in on some of the action, just know that it is for Red Snapper only.

Dear Alzafar, this is a fundraiser for our transportation account. All proceeds will help to transport children to/from our Galveston Hospital. If you would prefer not to go on the Alzafar Fishing Trip but would love to donate to our great cause, please make your checks out to the NEMNUF Unit, and please write in the memo "FISHING TRIP DONATION." We have a new social unit of equestrians who enjoy riding, learning, and working with horses.


Our elected officers for the 2021 Year are:






ALZAFAR SHOTGUN UNIT AKA SMOKIN CLAYS BY TERRY ZITTLE, SEXYTERRY

Sour Beers, What a Pickle

Sour beer is beer which has an intentionally acidic, tart, or sour taste. This is in contract to the traditional malty or bitter flavors most of us are used to. Challenging IPAs as the latest trend, sour beers have become very popular as of late.

Unlike modern brewing, which is done in a sanitary environment to guard against the intrusion of wild yeast, historically the starter used from one batch to another contained some wild yeast and bacteria. Sour beers are made by intentionally allowing wild yeast strains or bacteria into the brew, traditionally through the barrels or during the cooling of the wort in a coolship open to the outside air. The most common microbes used to intentionally sour beer are bacteria Lactobacillus and Pediococcus, while Brettanomyces can also add some acidity. Another method for achieving a tart flavor is adding fruit, which directly contributes organic acids such as citric acid. Additionally, acid can be directly added to beer or added by the use of excessive amounts of acidulated malt. Depending on the process employed, the uncertainty involved in using wild yeast may cause the beer to take months to ferment and potentially years to mature. However, modern methods allow sour beer to be created within a typical timeframe for ales, several days.

One example of a local sour beer, which includes dill pickle juice, is Freetail's Puro Pickles.

Freetail Puro Pickles is a kettle soured Gose Bier with

all-natural no preservative additions including cucumber puree, dill seed, coriander, salt, black pepper, and a splash of Pickle Juice to create a refreshing, sessionable beer.





Mozart was admitted as an Apprentice to the Viennese Masonic lodge called "Zur Wohltätigkeit" ("Beneficence") on 14 December 1784. He was passed to Fellow on 7 January 1785, and became a Master Mason "shortly thereafter" Mozart also attended the meetings of another lodge, called "Zur wahren Eintracht" ("True Concord"). According to Otto Erich Deutsch, this lodge was "the largest and most aristocratic in Vienna. ... Mozart, as the best of the musical 'Brothers,' was welcome in all the lodges." It was headed by the naturalist Ignaz von Born. Mozart's own lodge "Zur Wohltätigkeit" was consolidated with two others in December 1785, under the Imperial reform of Masonry (the Freimaurerpat-



ent, "Masonic Decree") of 11 December 1785, and thus Mozart came to belong to the lodge called "Zur Neugekrönten Hoffnung" (New Crowned Hope). At least as far as surviving Masonic documents can tell us, Mozart was well regarded by his fellow Masons. Many of his friends were Masons. During his visit to Vienna in 1785, Mozart's father Leopold also became a Mason.

Mozart's position within the Masonic movement, according to Maynard Solomon, lay with the rationalist, Enlightenment-inspired membership, as opposed to those members oriented toward mysticism and the occult. This rationalist faction is identified by Katharine Thomson as the Illuminati, a masonically inspired group which was founded by Bavarian pro-Page 16 fessor of canon law Adam Weishaupt, who was also a friend of Mozart. The Illuminati and rationalist Masons espoused the Enlightenment-inspired, humanist views proposed by the French philosophers Jean-Jacques Rousseau and Denis Diderot. For example, they contended that social rank was not coincident with nobility of the spirit, but that people of lowly class could be noble in spirit just as nobly born could be mean-spirited. This view appears in Mozart's operas; for example, in The Marriage of Figaro, an oppaniment, rather than polyphonic; and the melodic line was often richly ornamented with trills, runs and other virtuosic effects. The style promoted by the Masonic view was much less virtuosic and unornamented. Mozart's style of composition is often referred to as "humanist" and is in accord with this Masonic view of music.

The music of the Freemasons contained musical phrases and forms that held specific semiotic mean-

ings. For example, the Masonic initiation ceremony began with the candidate knocking three times at the door to ask admittance.

This figure appears in Mozart's opera The Magic Flute in the overture, suggesting the opening of the Masonic Master Mason's degree. According to Katherine Thomson, there are many other examples of specific musical symbols taken from the Masonic rites that appear throughout Mozart's compositions. These include the use of suspensions to indicate friendship and brotherhood, the use of three-part harmony to emphasize the special significance of the number three in Freemasonry, and special rhythms and harmonies to signify fortitude and other attributes.


Notwithstanding these


manifestations of Freemasonry in Mozart's music and activities, some scholars question Mozart's personal commitment to Masonic ideology. Peter Paul Fuchs notes that Mozart was a devout Catholic, a religion that threatened Freemasons with excommunication. "Mozart was pulled in various directions stylistically and probably personally. There is little evidence that he found these tensions troubling... " he writes. However in his book Mozart and the Enlightenment Nicholas Till demonstrates that Mozart's original lodge "Zur Wohltätigkeit" (At Beneficence) was a reform-Catholic lodge following the tenets of the Italian liberal theologian Ludovico Muratori and was committed in particular to the Catholic ideal of charity.

era based on a play by Pierre Beaumarchais (another Freemason), the low-born Figaro is the hero and the Count Almaviva is the boor.

The Freemasons used music in their ceremonies and adopted Rousseau's humanist views on the meaning of music. "The purpose of music in the Masonic ceremonies is to spread good thoughts and unity among the members" so that they may be "united in the idea of innocence and joy," wrote L.F. Lenz in a contemporary edition of Masonic songs. Music should "inculcate feelings of humanity, wisdom and patience, virtue and honesty, loyalty to friends, and finally an understanding of freedom." These views suggest a musical style quite unlike the style of the Galant, which was dominant at the time. Galant style music was typically melodic with harmonic accom-

For many, the opportunity to pursue education and training beyond high school is not easily within reach. When military members are asked why they serve, the available GI Bill® education benefits are often one reason why.

and women can also transfer all or part of their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits to their spouse and/or dependent children. This is called Transfer of Entitlement (TOE). Those wishing to transfer entitlement to a dependent must be sure to do this while still on active duty.

The option to transfer education assistance to dependent family members provides them with the financial means to pay for their education and training. However, until recently, this benefit was not available to all dependent children. With the recent passing of the Johnny Isakson and David P. Roe Veterans Health Care and Benefits Improvement Act of 2020, commonly referred to as Isakson and Roe, beginning January 6, 2021, service members can transfer all or part of their Post-9/11 GI Bill entitlement to their ward or foster child. This new law changes how VA administers education benefits, and more importantly, is a major step in recognizing the diversity of the Nation's military families and their unique needs.

According to the Department of Defense, more than five million people are part of today's military family. The men and women who serve in our Nation's armed forces are a diverse group. So, too, are their families, to include spouses, children and other family members who represent varying demographics, experiences and needs. With the implementation of Isakson and Roe, VA is able to address the needs of more families and ensure that the GI Bill's purpose is further realized. Now, even more military dependents can receive help paying for tuition, books and housing using Post-9/11 GI Bill education benefits. Eligible dependents, who are pursuing a degree or certification in a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) field, can maximize their benefits through the Edith Nourse Rogers STEM Scholarship. To help pay for higher out-of-state, private or graduate tuition that the Post-9/11 GI Bill doesn't cover, the Yellow Ribbon Program provides additional assistance. In addition to education and training, GI Bill benefits can provide other assistance to eligible students, such as help with paying for certain test fees and help with deciding on the right school or program, using the GI Bill Comparison Tool.

The spring months provide the Nation with an opportunity to celebrate those who serve and their families. As we celebrate service members and their families during Month of the Military Child in April and Military Appreciation Month in May, this is also an opportunity to celebrate the uniqueness of military families. In continued celebration of our Nation's military families, VA will continue to do its part to acknowledge the differences that make them unique, while ensuring that their unique needs are also met.


