In his public life, he was the County Recorder for Bexar County. He was married and had 3 children who, unfortunately, have passed themselves.

Fraternally I am surmising that he led by example, which was apparent by an overwhelming vote of confidence by the Nobles around him. You have probably seen him, but I'm betting many of you have passed by him and, not having met him personally, maybe didn't give him much notice. So I am introducing you to him by proxy.

Illustrious Sir Francis "Frank" R. Newton Alzafar's first Potentate in 1916. He lived from January 4, 1871, to October 9, 1956. He is interred at Alamo Masonic Cemetery in San Antonio, also known as Masonic Cemetery Alamo Lodge at 1801 E Commerce Street.

I can only hope we find some way to better memorialize each other as we go forward. Every Noble and their "story" is crucial since every Noble has made and you who read this will make Alzafar's legacy. Each month we recognize a Shriner of the Month. I think their story should be included in the Achbar so we can all get an idea of what keeps Alzafar going.
