



I started this year trying to get units and clubs in compliance with Shriners International








One phrase that I use is "Continuous Im-



and we are grateful.




THE BAND By: Richard Wallace

John Philip Sousa (1854-1932), the man called "March King," was proud to be a native-born American. And make no mistake that he was also proud to be a Mason.

Sousa's Masonic affiliations aren't common knowledge, but he entered Masonry at age 26 and was a



He came about petitioning the Craft naturally since his father was a Mason. Also, when Sousa became leader of the United States Marine Band in 1880, he learned the impor-



It is interesting that quite a few members of Sousa's professional civilian band, formed after he left the Marine Corps, were Masons. The percentage increased when Sousa became a Shriner in 1922, and toward the end of his career, nearly half the bandsmen themselves were Shriners. Shrine organizations around the country sponsored many Sousa Band Concerts in the late 1920s.

His patriotism was even more evident during World War I. At age 62, he enlisted in the U.S. Navy (at the symbolic salary of \$1/ month) to train Navy bandsmen at Great Lakes Naval Training Station north of Chicago. While there, he took a huge "jackie" band (a band made up of recruits) on a tour to raise money for war causes. When regrouping the Sousa Band after the war, he usually wore his lieutenant commander's uniform at concerts.

The most famous of all his marches is, or course, "The Stars and Stripes Forever." It is our official national march and is considered by many to be the finest march ever written. The title says exactly what Sousa meant it to say. One can only imagine the lecture received by his publisher, who suggested that "Forever" be removed from the title! "The Stars and Stripes Forever" is now part of our national heritage, and Sousa did his utmost to make it that way. Stories of his personal acts of patriotism could easily fill a book. When we speak of him as one of our Masonic Brothers, we can all stand a little taller.

John Philip Sousa's Masonic History:


- 15 July 1881, Initiated, Hiram Lodge No. 10, Washington, DC (never transferred);
- 2 September 1881, Passed, Hiram Lodge;
- 10 November 1881, Raised, Hiram Lodge;
- 16 September 1886, Received Capitular Degrees and exalted in Eureka Chapter No. 4 (later Eureka Naval Chapter);
- 3 December 1886, Received Order of Red Cross, Malta, and Temple
- 10 December 1886, Knighted in Columbia Commandery No. 2, Knights Templar, Washington, DC;
- 21 April 1922, Initiated in A.A.O.N.M.S., Almas Temple, Washington, D.C., named honorary leader of Almas Temple Band;
- 10 March 1932, a Masonic memorial service was held at the grave site in Congressional Cemetery, Washington, DC, after Sousa's death. This band has performed several ceremonies at Sousa's grave.

§ 325.11 Election Regulations.

- (a) Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish, and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a résumé consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email, or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) Expenditures Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
- (d) Notice. At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

He is purity, he is power, he is strength, he is boldness, he is innocence, he is mysterious and elusive and he embodies the spirit and heart of the Scottish. He is the National animal of Scotland. He is, in Scottish Gaelic, aon-adharcach. He is, the mighty and grand unicorn.

From wee fairies, monsters of a Loch, seals that crawl upon the land to walk in human form, wolf men of Shetland and numerous other fantastic things, mother Scotland finds herself host to a great many unique and unusual beasties. There are, however, none that stand more majestic and a kin to the culture of the Scot than the unicorn. The great steed is a symbol of the free and wild heart of the Scottish. He stands as a testament to the spirit of a people who could not be bridled, beaten, captured or tamed.

Possibly making its first debut in history as far

back as 400 BC, the unicorn galloped its way into Celtic mythology and was thus later adopted by Scotland around the 15th century as the country's official national animal. It was considered a symbol of chivalry, masculinity, power and purity. The dominance that this creature represented made it a natural choice for



the proud Scots. Interestingly enough this uni-horned beast was the natural enemy of the lion, and as the lion represented England, the unicorn was an even more fitting and appropriate choice for Scotland's National beastie. Look closely upon the Scottish coat of arms and one will note a crown around the neck of the unicorn with a chain wrapped around its body. This was because only a Scottish king was powerful and pure enough to capture and harness the magical monoceros .

In the early 1600's King James VI united the two kingdoms as James VI of Scotland and James I of England thus marrying the lion and unicorn upon the royal crest. The marriage was historically a rocky one and even to this day you can see remnants of the feuding countries reflect-

ed in the royal seal. In Scotland you will find the unicorn standing to the left of the royal seal but in England the lion stands upon the left.

I joined the Alzafar Divan as our Oriental Guide in 2006. I had told our Chief Rabban Joe Calvey how horrified I was with our Achbar. For decades, the Achbar had been created on a very cheap newsprint with little color. Alzafar had contracted with a local magazine producer named Neighborhood News, which had a strong presence in the area neighborhoods wishing to keep their Homeowners Associations informed of happenings. The original agreement had the company agree to sell ads to offset the cost of producing our 16-page Achbar. We were making over 2400 issues and mailing the editions on our postal permit first class mail. Our monthly Achbar expense was approaching \$6,000, which included postage.

I had more than a novice understanding of advertising and the product it proposes to deliver. I was convinced that Alzafar could do better. I asked our Potentate to allow me to create a cover or two. He agreed, believing we couldn't do any worse. Noble Joe Calvey, our 2006 Chief Rabban, told me I could take over its creation should he prevail and become Alzafar's Potentate the following year.

I had been using Adobe products for years since I took over the Achbar creation. I couldn't do too much since I had only used it as needed and had often let the software lapse for lack of use. I began creating the Achbar full-time in 2007. There were some crucial failings right from the start. The units would send in articles irregularly, and we used first-class postage to send out the Achbar via Neighborhood News. For some unknown reason, it would take weeks to receive the current issue of the Achbar. More often than not, the Achbar was created for a subsequent month while awaiting the current topic. That made it challenging to post meeting dates and events as they would pass, and

the Achbar making its announcement would still be in the printers' hands.

My pal Noble Don Starnes had become Recorder the year before I joined the Divan. I quickly found out that our mailing list was faulty. For many years, incoming Potentates hesitated to expel members for failing to pay their dues, which would negatively affect Imperial standing as our membership declined. Our first effort was to certify our mailing list using the CASS software. I then called a commercial printer for a price on printing the Achbar. I was told they wouldn't quote as our current provider was their precious customer. I would need to know more to deliver a product that a commercial printer could create. I took over a year to learn how to typeset a magazine. And the Achbar began its correct evolution.

It seems like I have just now been able to create the images that tell our story, and I must retire. If you spend time on a computer, you can imagine my struggle with two shaky hands. So, it is with much sadness that I say goodbye for now. If a unit would like to have their cut of the logo I created for the Achbar, you need to ask. I will hold on to the images I have created for the Achbar and the several Circus programs I produced. Not all images can transfer to another, as I may have purchased another graphic artist's base image in my additive result. So, you must ask. To the incoming editor, much success, and may our membership continue to be supportive and engaged.
