§ 325.11 Election Regulations.

- (a) Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish, and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a résumé consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email, or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) Expenditures Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

(d) Notice, At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

In days of old, in times thus lost; tales of Scotland entice us still with legend and lore buried in an heir of truth. From the bagpipe to the kilt, from Nessie to Whisky, Scotland relinquishes from its past a montage of unique and alluring artifacts. As so it is with the varied meaning and romanticized notion of the Quaich, pronounced kway-ch (the ch sounds like that in Loch).

Ah, ya dinna kin what a quaich is? Well plop your bahookie down in a cozy chair, pour yourself a wee dram and let's have a swatch at it. The name Quaich, derives from the Scottish Gaelic word "cuach", which simply means "cup." The quaich is a two-handled drinking vessel with a round shallow bowl. Its first known use was in the Highlands of Scotland in the 17th century and may have

had its origins from the likeness of scallop shells or Druid bleeding bowls. Several wooden versions have been found from the 19th century but a quaich may be found made of any number of



materials or blend of materials from wood to glass to silver. Aye, but hold on there lad. This is no wee driech bowl to pour your ginger in for a quick swally. No. It is in fact a quite bonnie thing with many a meaningful purpose.

The quaich is very much a ceremonial or celebratory piece. It has been employed by clan chiefs, lovers, friends, and even perhaps adversaries in a moment of truth and truce. Legend has it that when two men of questionable motives would meet they would share a drink in a quaich. It would act both as a vessel symbolizing peace and as a precautionary tool. Upon meeting, the host would offer the other the bowl by holding it by its two handles while passing it to the visitor who would, then in turn, used both hands to receive it. Thus, a man's hands could be seen free of any dangerous tools of war and the two could meet in peace. At times, the bottom of the quaich may have even been made of glass as to keep a wary eye on one another.

A quaich can be used in a wedding, both lovers sipping from the cup as they take their Continued on Page 12

vows. It is a means to welcome friends into your home, a vessel of celebration at a baby's baptism, a chalice to toast in honor and any other celebratory or blessed occasion. It can be given as a gift engraved or adorned in any manner of material. It remains an object of love, friendship and unity. Grab a quaich, grab a friend, have a dram and be braw Brathairs.

To learn more about Scotland, hear some bagpipe music, share in Fellowship and have some water of life, come join the Highlanders on a Wednesday evening at 6:30 pm in room 9. We also have several events coming up in the next several months as well. We have Robert Burn's night coming up in January on the 27th and will share in Scottish scran (food), poetry, and of course, Scottish music. Don't be a crabbit, come be a part of the celebration.

We will also have a Whisky tasting coming up on April 13 2024. Mark your calendar!! B. Skill Development:


Writing monthly articles hones communication and storytelling skills among unit leaders.





omeone came to your unit and said they wanted to be Alzafar's Potentate in 2028. They want to be elected OG, but he truly wants the top spot. When the members of a Shrine Temple elect a Noble to the office of Oriental Guide, they are virtually starting that Noble through the Divan line on the assumption that he will prove qualified for any merit achievement to the high office of Potentate. As you vote to fill the office of Alzafar's Potentate, you are handing him control of about one million dollars. Past leaders have done everything possible to make our membership believe Alzafar is a genuinely autocratic society. Imperial bylaws disagree with that notion and dictate that every Noble on the Divan, including the Potentate, work as a board of trusted advisors. Advisors to whom you might ask. They are advisors to us, the Nobility of Alzafar Shriners. Much of what they tell us is in the annual budget, which we tend to approve with a voice vote.

Are you familiar with the psychological principle called the Dunning-Krueger effect? In its simplest terms, it means that a foolish person doesn't know he is stupid. Conversely, intelligent people with an easy way to accomplish tasks believe that anyone can do what they perform so effortlessly. It is between these two that we must find our future leaders. Hence, it is pretty evident that the nominations for Oriental Guide should be based upon a thorough and accurate evaluation of character, ability, and interest. A Noble can be a good fellow, a diligent worker, and a loyal Shriner...and yet lack the essential qualifications that make a Potentate. Unless a Noble is fully qualified for the job, he is unfair to himself and Alzafar in seeking office or permitting his fellow nobles to support and promote his candidacy.

The typical starting point of Shrine leadership is the office of Oriental Guide. The following checklist may prove helpful in evaluating potential candidates for the office of Oriental Guide. However, no thinking man would be so naïve or presumptuous as to all the virtues, talents, and qualifications outlined in this checklist for the voting members' advanced evaluation of potential candidates.

Leadership:

- Executive ability.
- Business sense.
- Community standing and influence.
- Financially secure.
- Free to donate ample time.
- Capable of building good public relations.
- Good habits and moral character.
- Interest in Shrinedom.
- Ability to give and get cooperation.
- Diplomacy.
- He has full support from his wife and family.

So, let's be fair, honest, and deliberately wise in the all-important matter of electing to office only men who are eminently qualified for the job. We all know that with the honor comes responsibility. And while there is high honor associated with a Divan office, the ensuing responsibilities entail a lot of time-consuming, energy-consuming WORK! As a community service and non-profit, there are always eyes upon us as an organization; it is a fallacy to believe that Alzafar is free of bad actors. Sadly, our experience has proved this to be true. A sitting Potentate was accused, arrested, tried, and convicted by a jury of his peers of abuse so horrific as to create staggering emotions within the body of Alzafar. As an organization that stands for truth, justice, and honor, there continue to be some fully participating members of Alzafar who seek a continued relationship with such a vile individual. Yes, vile. Not because I say so but because our precepts demand it. As Masons all, we are charged with strict rules of self-discipline. Examine thoroughly the conduct of each candidate who stands for your trust.
