

Hello Nobles







NOTICE

My fellow Nobles,

At the August 11th Stated Meeting, a written Resolution to Amend the Bylaws was presented in accordance with Article XIII Section 1 of our current Bylaws. Pursuant to the aforementioned Section of the Bylaws, we are including this NO-TICE to each member that a VOTE will be held at the September 8th Stated Meeting to adopt the proposed changes.

Pursuant the Bylaws, this NOTICE must contain the text or substance of the proposed changes. As there are many changes being proposed, this notice will include a summary of them, and you are hereby NOTIFIED that a full copy of the Resolution and Proposed Changes may be obtained in the Alzafar Office or by emailing Michael Ethridge at me@michaelgethridge.com.

Proposed changes include:

- Correcting non-substantive spelling, grammatical, and typographic errors
- Removing the word "Temple" from the Bylaws
- Authorizing the Alzafar Treasurer to wear his title on his Fez and clarifying other Fez adornment rules
- Removing specific dollar amounts from the Bylaws for dues and initiation fees and allowing for automatic dues increases when Imperial increases the per capita
- Updating the process for dues card dissemination and updates
- Allowing the Divan to assign the Recorder's non-fraternal duties to a hired businessmanager
- Aligning our Stated Meeting requirements with that of Imperial Bylaws
- Updating the names of the Hospitals
- Enabling the Recorder to send out certain email notifications, with restrictions

The full text of the Resolution is included herewith.

Again, these proposed changes were presented at the August 11th Stated Meeting, discussion was had among the Nobility, questions were answered, and the Resolution was laid upon the table to be adopted at the September 8th Stated Meeting. If you would like to review the Minutes of the August 11th Stated Meeting, please contact the Recorder.

A Resolution To Amend the Bylaws of Alzafar Shriners

Whereas the currently adopted Bylaws contain numerous non-substantive spelling, grammatical, and typographic errors that require correction;

Whereas the Imperial Council has recommended that references to the word "Temple" be removed and replaced with something reflecting modern vernacular;

Whereas the Divan of Alzafar Shriners wishes to formally allow the Treasurer the right to wear his title on his Fez and clarify other appropriate Fez adornments;

Whereas the recommendation of the Imperial Council is to remove references to specific dollar amounts for initiation fees and annual dues, allowing for easier adjustment without an entire amendment to the Bylaws;

Whereas the Imperial Council has updated the process by which annual dues cards are disseminated and now offers updated stickers for each year as well as a digital version of the dues card;

Whereas the Divan of Alzafar Shriners proposes changes to the Duties of the Recorder to increase office efficiency, productivity, and organization.

Whereas the Divan of Alzafar Shriners wishes to align the number of required Stated Meetings with Imperial Bylaws, reducing the meeting burden on the Nobility.

Whereas the Hospital system no longer uses the name "Shriners Hospitals for Crippled Children" and has added the term "Shriners Children's;"

Whereas the Divan of Alzafar Shriners wishes to enable electronic communication for specific notices and announcements; and

Whereas Article XIII Section 1 of the Alzafar Shriners Bylaws require Amendments to be presented in writing in the form of a Resolution at a Stated Meeting, laid over to the next Stated Meeting or to a Special Meeting called for action thereon, a notice of said meeting sent to every member of the Temple at least seven (7) days before such meeting reciting the text or substance of the proposed Amendments, then adopted by a 2/3 affirmative vote of the membership present and voting

Now, therefore, be it Resolved that the Nobility of Alzafar Shriners:

- 1. Approves and adopts the attached proposed amendments to the Bylaws of the Alzafar Shriners; and
- 2. Orders and Directs the Recorder to report this Resolution with the newly adopted Bylaws to the Imperial Recorder together with accompanying documents as required by Shrine Law

Greetings from your Princes of potable of potations. In the secret to making great beer there are 4 main ingredients:

Water- it has a huge impact on beer, as the largest component, it adds flavor directly to the product through it varied chemical make-up. Thus, the same beer brewed in different locations can be totally different in taste and quality. Breweries have a recipe for their water to insure their taste and sapidity.

Hops- they are used primarily as a bittering, flavoring, and stability agent in beer, to which, in addition to bitterness, they impart floral, fruity, or citrus flavors and aromas. Hops are also used in brewing for their antibacterial effect over less desirable microorganisms and for purported benefits including balancing the sweetness of the malt Malt-is a germinated seed used to produce starch and flavors to a beer in its fermentation stage. The malting process requires you to soak, sprout and dry the wheat, oat, barley, rye, and other cereals accordingly. In the end, you acquire malty grains that produce a sugary and bread-like character in a brew.

Yeast-works hard but really enjoys itself. This little, single-cell organism, one of the simplest forms of plant life, is responsible for carrying out the fermentation process in beer making, thereby providing one of life's simplest forms of pleasure (and its production of carbon dioxide is what causes bread dough to rise). Many brewers consider their yeast to be their most secret ingredient.

Orvon Eugene Autry (1907-1998)

Orvon Eugene Autry was born on September 29, 1907, not far from Tioga, Texas. He was the grandson of a minister. In the early 1920's, while in his teens, the family moved to Ravia, Oklahoma. When not on school, Gene took to playing his guitar and herding cattle on his father's ranch.

To earn a little extra cash for the family, Gene became a

part-time telegrapher. Between transmissions he played his guitar and sang Western songs. One afternoon another Oklahoman – none other than Will Rogers – came into the telegraph office and heard Gene's voice and guitar playing. Rogers was impressed. He encouraged Gene to start playing professionally. Gene took Bro. Rogers' advice. His singing and radio career started after leaving high school in 1925. Hid first real break came when he starred as "Oklahoma's Yodeling Cowboy" on KVOO radio in Tulsa. That led to a record contract with Columbia Records. Gene became interested in Masonry and around this time joined Catoosa Lodge No. 185 in Oklahoma. Soon after he was picked up ny WLS in Chicago and the National Barn Dance program. In 1930 and 1931, he visited New York to record what was called "hillbilly music."

Gene's first major hit, That Silver Haired Daddy of Mine, was recorded in 1932 with Jimmie Long. This collaboration led to one hit after another. Gene recorded over 640 songs and had either written or co-written more than 300 of them. Some of his more popular songs include Santa Clause is Coming to Town, Here Comes Santa Clause, Frosty the Snowman, and his all-time biggest hit Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer. By the end of his career Gene had sold over 100 million records, receiving the first ever gold record, followed by eleven more gold and platinum records. He was voted into the Country Music and Nashville Songwriters halls of fame, in 1969 and 1970, respectively. His success led his founding Challenge Records,

which produced many hits.

In the 1930's and 1940's Gene expanded his career in to the movies until after WWII. He continued with radio with the CBS radio show Gene Autry's Melody Ranch. The show was so popular that after a short retirement, he returned the movies. Even his horse Champion had his own show, The Adventures of Champion.

In the 1950's, the introduction of comic stimulated interest in reading. They included what Gene called the Cowboy Code and here one can see the influence of Masonry. 1. Never shoot first, hit a smaller man, or take an unfair advantage.; 2. Never go back on his word, or a trust confided in him.; 3. Always tell the truth.; 4. Be gentle with children, the elderly, and animals.; 5. Not advocate or possess racially or religiously intolerant ideas.; 6. Help people in distress.; 7. Be a good worker.; 8. Keep himself clean in thought, speech, and action. 9. Respect women, parents, and his nation's laws.; 10. Be a patriot.

By the time he retired from show business he had achieved something which wilk never be matched: Gene Autry was awarded five Hollywood Walk of Fame stars for: 1. Radio; 2. Stage; 3. Screen; 4. Records; and 5. TV.

One might think that was enough, but not Bro. Autry. He invested his earnings in. real estate, radio stations, and TV. He purchased the right to Republic Pictures and all of his old films thereby insuring a continued stream of income from reruns.

In 1960, Major League Baseball had plans for an expansion team in Los Angles. Autry approached MLB with an interest in radio and TV rights to the new team. They were so impressed with his acumen they refused him the rights unless he became the team's owner! He entered his final career as a baseball team owner and promoter, wearing the team jersey number 26. The team was initially called the LA Angels, which was changed to the California Angels and then to the Anaheim Angels before returning to the original name in 2005.

When the Angels finally won the World Series in 2002, the old Gene Autry theme song. Back in the Saddle Again was played over the stadium's speakers as fireworks exploded.


